Constitution of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, Inc.

(First Reading of the proposed changes approved at the 2022 BCM/D Annual Meeting)

Article I • Name

The body will be called the Baptist Convention of Maryland/ Delaware, Inc.

Article II • Mission Statement

Section 1—The Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware will intentionally assist in the starting and strengthening of congregations so that together we can fulfill Jesus' commands in Matthew 28:19-20 and Acts 1:8.

Section 2—This Convention is an autonomous body and is neither limited nor restrained by any authority or decision of any other Baptist body and will achieve its objectives through such means as this Convention alone determines.

Section 3—This Convention does not have any ecclesiastical authority to limit the autonomy of the local congregation.

Section 4—This Convention recognizes the Southern Baptist Convention as our primary instrument to further the cause of Christ on a worldwide basis. This Convention pledges its loyalty and support to the purposes served by the Southern Baptist Convention.

Article III • Membership

Section 1—The membership of this Convention will consist of messengers who are members of Baptist churches which are in friendly cooperation with this Convention and sympathetic with its purpose and work, and which have during the preceding 12 months (October 1 through September 30) been bona fide contributors to the work of this Convention.

Membership will cease when Baptist churches are no longer either in friendly cooperation with this convention and sympathetic with its mission and work, no longer affirm the Baptist Faith & Message 2000.

Section 2—Each cooperating member church meeting the requirements in Article III Section 1 will be entitled to two (2) messengers; each cooperating church exceeding fifty (50) members will then be given one additional messenger for each additional fifty (50) members or part thereof; or one additional messenger for each \$750 contributed to the work of this Convention through the Cooperative Program until the maximum of thirty (30) is reached.

Section 3—Messengers to this Convention will be certified by their churches. This Convention will be the final judge of election and qualifications of its members.

Section 4—The officers of this Convention, the employed staff of this Convention, and its agencies may be messengers provided they are elected by the church in which they hold membership.

Article IV • Meetings

Section 1—This Convention will meet at least once each year, hereafter known as the Annual Meeting, at such time and place as may be fixed by this Convention at the Annual Meeting held the preceding year. The duly appointed messengers of the cooperating churches will comprise the voting body of this Convention.

Section 2—In case of an emergency, the General Mission Board is empowered to change the time and place of meeting or call a special meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members present and voting.

Section 3—Notice of any special meeting will be given at least thirty (30) days prior thereto by publication online or in such other ways as the General Mission Board may direct.

Article V • Officers

Section 1—The Officers of this Convention will be a President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, Corporate Secretary, Treasurer, Recording Secretary, and an Assistant Recording Secretary. All but the Corporate Secretary and Treasurer will be elected at each Annual Meeting by a majority of the duly elected messengers present and voting, and will hold office until their successors are elected and installed. Employees of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware are ineligible to serve as officers of this Convention with the exception of the Executive Director who will serve as Corporate Secretary and the Director of Finance who will serve as Treasurer.

Section 2—Nominations will be from the floor. Election will be by ballot except where there is a single nominee for an office. In the latter case, the President will instruct the Secretary to cast a unanimous ballot for the nominee.

Section 3—Officers will serve for one (1) year and hold office until their successors are elected and qualified; however, the President and Vice Presidents may not serve more than two (2) complete successive terms in office. Terms of office will commence at final adjournment of the Annual Meeting in session at the time of their election and terminate in the final adjournment of the succeeding regular session of the Annual Meeting. In case of death, disability of, or other cause making necessary the retirement of the President, the Vice Presidents will succeed in order. The General Mission Board will determine when an office is vacant due to the disability of an incumbent.

Section 4—The President will preside over the deliberations of the Annual Meeting and will perform other duties as may be customary to the position or as determined in the Bylaws, and will become an ex officio member of all Convention committees and boards. The President will continue as ex officio member of the General Mission Board for one full year immediately following tenure as President of this Convention unless elected to fill a vacancy in the regular membership of the Board.

Section 5—The Vice President may, in the absence of the President or when requested by the President, preside over the Annual Meeting and will perform other duties as may be provided in the Bylaws or as requested by the President.

Section 6—The Secretary will keep accurate minutes of all sessions of this Convention and will cause these to be published in suitable form in the Annual of this Convention together with other information as this Convention or the General Mission Board of this Convention deems necessary and proper.

Section 7—The President will be authorized to sign legal papers for the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, Inc. If unable to do so, the First Vice President or the Second Vice President will be so authorized.

Section 8—Should the President and Vice Presidents be unable to serve, the duties of the President will devolve upon the President of the General Mission Board until said Board will elect an interim President.

Article VI • General Mission Board

Section 1—This Convention will elect a General Mission Board to be known as the General Mission Board, none of whose members will be employees of said Board. Fifty-one percent will be a quorum for business.

The Rules of Order for the meetings of the General Mission Board will be those in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order.

The General Mission Board will be composed of three members from the geographic area of each association. For each 5000 resident members or major fraction thereof, one additional Board member will be chosen, up to but not to exceed a total of ten Board members from any association. The President of this Convention, the President of the Woman's Missionary Union and the Maryland/Delaware member of the Southern Baptist Convention Executive Committee will serve as atlarge members of the Board. Board members selected by virtue of their Convention offices, will not be used in determining the number of members from an association or local church.

The term of the office of the members will be four years with, as nearly as possible, the terms of one-fourth of the members expiring each year. Any member serving for a full term or three years of an unexpired term will not be eligible for reelection until one year has expired.

Membership on the Board will cease when the member dies, moves membership from a church within the Convention, or the member's church ceases to be in cooperating fellowship with this Convention. In the event a member moves from a church in one association to another within this Convention, or the member's church changes from one association to another within this Convention, the member will be eligible to serve until a successor is elected at the next Annual Meeting. Membership on the Board will automatically be terminated when a member is absent for two consecutive meetings of the Board without notification submitted to the Board President or the Executive Director. The member will be notified of such termination.

Section 2—The members of the General Mission Board will be elected by this Convention, after receiving nominations from the committee selected by this Convention for this purpose, and after giving opportunity for nominations from the floor of this Convention.

Section 3—The work of this Convention, except as otherwise specified, will be committed to the General Mission Board described as follows: The General Mission Board of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware will act for this Convention ad interim promoting all the interests of the Kingdom, such as evangelism, missions, education, benevolence, social welfare, and public morals, and so on. The General Mission Board will not have authority to control the agencies and institutions of this Convention, but it will maintain general care and responsibility for the work of same. It is instructed to study annually their reports, to interpret and apply the rules of the constitution and the business and

financial policy of this Convention as items may apply to any of the agencies of this Convention, to make recommendations directly to agencies and also to make whatever recommendations to this Convention concerning them it may deem advisable.

Section 4—This Convention will annually elect members to fill all vacancies on the Board.

Article VII • Agencies

Section 1—The Convention may establish agencies for the purpose of performing collateral Christian services. An agency will be a separate corporation independent of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware in its day-to-day operations but will work in cooperation with the Convention in order to avoid costly duplication. The Convention and each agency will establish, through the General Mission Board, an agreement defining their working relationship. An agency of this Convention will act in accordance with our historic Baptist doctrine and practices.

Section 2—The trustees of these agencies will be elected by this Convention after receiving nominations from the Committee selected by this Convention for this purpose and after giving opportunity for nominations from the floor of this Convention. The number of trustees for each agency and their terms of office will be in accordance with the requirements of their respective charters and bylaws.

Section 3—All agencies sharing in the Cooperative Program receipts must include a summary of their financial report in the annual report to the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, and the General Mission Board will request a copy of the budget of all agencies sharing in the Cooperative Program receipts along with their requests for financial assistance.

Section 4—No agency of this Convention will create any liability or indebtedness (except such as can and will be repaid out of its anticipated receipts for current operations within a period of three years) without the consent of this Convention or the General Mission Board. In order to obtain such approval, the agency must file a statement showing the source of such anticipated receipts. Such consent must be likewise obtained for a purchase of properties or construction of same, subject to liens or encumbrances which cannot be repaid out of its anticipated receipts for current operations within a period of three years.

Section 5—Proposals for the establishment of new agencies must follow one of the following procedures: (1) Authority may be granted upon favorable vote by two successive Annual Meetings, or (2) Authority may be granted by vote of one Annual Meeting provided a favorable recommendation is made by the General Mission Board, after thorough study, and provided further that the proposal is published online 45 days before the Annual Meeting or in such other ways as the General Mission Board may direct.

Section 6—The agency of this Convention is the Baptist Foundation of Maryland/Delaware, Inc.

Article VIII • Business and Financial Policy

Section 1—This Convention approves the Cooperative Program of Southern Baptists as its plan of world mission work and appeals to the churches to support it and to recognize the wisdom and right of this Convention to divide equitably the Cooperative Program receipts.

Section 2—Cooperative Program gifts will be distributed on a percentage basis approved by this Convention and designated gifts according to the wishes of the donors. The Administrative Committee of the General Mission Board will recommend at each preconvention meeting of the General Mission Board the Cooperative Program goal and the distribution of receipts for the following year. Financial reports will be given at each meeting of the Board and an annual review conducted.

Section 3—The fiscal year of the General Mission Board and this Convention will be the calendar year.

Section 4—All funds entrusted to this Convention or to any of its boards or agencies will be strictly applied according to the expressed will and direction of the donors.

Section 5—This Convention will receive contributions, legacies and bequests for the several objects which it fosters. The Baptist Foundation of Maryland/Delaware, Inc., is the agency designated for the management of trust funds.

Article IX • The Denominational Paper

Section 1—The BaptistLIFE will be the official news journal of this Convention.

Section 2—The General Mission Board of this Convention will be responsible for the conduct of this phase of our work through the Executive Director.

Article X • Woman's Missionary Union

The Woman's Missionary Union of Maryland/Delaware is recognized as an auxiliary of this Convention whose accomplishments and potentialities in good works are appreciated as being of immeasurable value to the Christian cause.

Article XI • Miscellaneous

Section 1—Neither this Convention nor any agency owned or supported in whole or in part by this Convention, will accept or receive, directly or indirectly, any gift, grant, or aid from the Federal or State governments or any governmental agency except for definite and full services rendered by the agency with the approval of this Convention or its General Mission Board. In any debatable instance that may occur, the General Mission Board will interpret this statement subject to the approval of this Convention.

Section 2—Any special campaign for funds must be specifically approved by vote of this Convention or the General Mission Board.

Article XII • Amendment

All amendments to this constitution must be submitted in writing at an Annual Meeting. A vote will be taken when the amendment is presented and at the succeeding annual session. The proposed amendment may be modified in form but not in substance upon presentation for vote at the second session. The amendment will be adopted only after an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the messengers present and voting at two successive Annual Meetings. Non-substantive changes such as grammatical corrections and title or name changes may be made by the Administrative Committee of the General

Mission Board and included in their report at the Annual Meeting of the Baptist Convention of

Maryland/Delaware.

Bylaws of the Baptist Convention of

Maryland/Delaware, Inc.

(Revised at the 2021 BCM/D Annual Meeting)

The work of this Convention will be governed by the following bylaws:

Article I • Duties of Officers

Section 1—The President will preside over the deliberations of the Annual Meeting and discharge such other duties as are imposed by this Convention or as are incumbent on the presiding officer of a deliberating body. At least two months prior to the Annual Meeting, the President, in consultation with the two Vice Presidents, will appoint a Committee on Credentials and Enrollment, a Committee on Committees, a Resolutions Committee, and other committees when so directed by the Body (see Article II, Section 1). In case of death or incapacity to serve, the Vice Presidents will succeed the President in order.

Section 2—A First Vice President and a Second Vice President will discharge such duties as requested by the President, will serve as ex officio members of the General Mission Board, and in the event of the death or disability of the President, will succeed the President in order of their rank.

Section 3—The Recording Secretary will record and preserve the proceedings of this Convention and will, in cooperation with the Executive Director, have the same published. The Assistant Recording Secretary will serve in the absence of the Recording Secretary and assist as necessary.

Section 4—The Corporate Secretary will perform the duties legally required of this office.

Section 5—The President and the Executive Director will be advisory to all Convention committees and agencies.

Article II • Committees and Their Duties

Administrative Guidelines for All Committees

All committees will reflect, as much as possible, a balance between vocational ministers and others. An ex-officio member will have voting privileges. No person will be elected to serve simultaneously on more than one standing committee.

No church will have more than two representatives simultaneously elected to serve on BCM/D committees, the General Mission Board, or as trustees of a BCM/D institution or agency.

Committees of this Convention may appoint persons other than members to special limited purpose subcommittees and advisory committees provided such persons will serve only in an advisory capacity and will not be permitted to vote at meetings of the authorizing committee.

Membership on committees will cease when the member dies, moves membership from a church within the Convention, or the member's church ceases to be in cooperating fellowship with this Convention. In the event a member moves from a church in one association to another within this Convention, or the member's church changes from one association to another within this Convention, the member will be eligible to serve until a successor is elected at the next Annual Meeting. Membership on the Board will automatically be terminated when a member is absent for two consecutive meetings of the Board without notification submitted to the Board President or the Executive Director. The member will be notified of such termination.

In the event of a vacancy between Annual Meetings, the President shall appoint members to fill that vacancy as an interim until approval at the next Annual Meeting. This would apply to all BCM/D committees.

Section 1—In advance of the Annual Meeting, the President will appoint the following committees:

1. Committee on Credentials and Enrollment—The committee will consist of five members whose duties it will be to register messengers and visitors. This committee will review and rule upon any questions which may arise in registration concerning the credentials of messengers. Any such ruling may be appealed to this Convention during business session. This Committee will make a report to the assembled messengers upon the call of the President, and will pass on the credentials of all messengers.

The Committee on Credentials and Enrollment will function under the following guidelines:

- Each person elected by a church, cooperating with the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, as a messenger to the Annual Meeting will be registered as a messenger to this Convention upon presentation of proper credentials. Credentials will be presented by each messenger, in person, at the Convention registration desk and will be in the following form:
- A completed and signed BCM/D registration card certifying the messenger's election in accordance with Article III Membership of the Constitution of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, Inc.; but if the messenger does not have the messenger registration card,
- A letter from the messenger's church, signed by the clerk or moderator of the church certifying messenger's election in accordance with Article III Membership of the Constitution of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, Inc.; or
- 2. Committee on Committees—This committee will consist of one member from each association whose duty it will be to nominate for election by this Convention the members and chairpersons of the committees listed in Sections 2 and 3 of this article, with the exception of the Committee on Committees, and other committees as may be assigned to it. Members of this committee will be appointed to a three-year term, one-third of its number retiring each year. A member of this committee cannot be nominated as a member of the General Mission Board, a trustee of the agencies of this Convention, or a member of any Convention committee.
- **3. Resolutions Committee**—This committee will consist of five members. It will be responsible for initiating, reviewing, researching, preparing and recommending all resolutions for adoption. Only

resolutions presented to the Resolutions Committee at least 45 days in advance of the Annual Meeting will be considered by the committee before the first session. Other resolutions may be referred to the committee by the general body during the session as described in Article VI, Section 2. Resolutions should seek to build up and unify the body rather than divide it; therefore, only resolutions that have the full consensus of the committee will be presented at the Annual Meeting.

An announcement will be published online, or in such other ways as the General Mission Board may direct, no later than 75 days before the Annual Meeting requesting resolutions for the committee's consideration and possible presentation at the Annual Meeting. Proposed resolutions will be submitted in writing and addressed to either committee members or to: Resolutions Committee, BCM/D, 10255 Old Columbia Road, Columbia, Maryland 21046-1716.

Section 2—This Convention will elect the following committees to report to the next Annual Meeting:

- 1. Committee on Order of Business—This committee will consist of one member from each association. The members of this committee will be elected to a three-year term, one-third of their number retiring each year. The committee will be responsible for recommending to this Convention the place, time, preacher, and music director of the Annual Meeting one year hence and, if feasible, the time and place two years hence. The committee will present to the opening session of the Annual Meeting for adoption, a recommended agenda for the Annual Meeting.
- 2. Committee to Nominate the Members of the General Mission Board and Trustees of the Agencies of this Convention—This committee will consist of one member from each association. Members of this committee will be elected to a three-year term, one-third of their number retiring each year. The head of an agency, or his representative, will meet with the committee to suggest names for consideration on the committee, for vacancies on the respective agency's board of trustees and for the agency's representatives on the General Mission Board. A member of this committee cannot be nominated as a member of the General Mission Board, a trustee of the agencies of this Convention, or a member of any Convention committee.
- 3. The Christian Life and Public Affairs Committee—This committee will act for this Convention in the field of Christian ethics, public affairs, interfaith cooperation, and Christian social concerns. Specifically, but not exclusively, these areas will include family life, human relations, race relations, moral issues, economic life, daily work, citizenship, church-state relations, cooperative relationships with other religious groups, and those areas where the gospel and the churches affect or are affected by community and public life. The Christian Life and Public Affairs Committee may act on matters referred to it by this Convention, by the General Mission Board, or by any agency of this Convention

The Christian Life and Public Affairs Committee will be responsible for initiating consideration and study, and for recommending action of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware and/or General Mission Board on any matter or issue falling within the scope and purpose as set forth in the preceding paragraph.

The committee will be elected and directly responsible to the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware. It will report annually to this Convention.

The committee is authorized to make pronouncements on matters within its scope and purpose in as far as they are consistent with actions previously taken by the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware,

the General Mission Board, or the Southern Baptist Convention. However, under no circumstances will the committee assume the exercise of authority for this Convention, its agencies or the churches.

The Christian Life and Public Affairs Committee will be composed of one member from each association. At least half the members will be lay people. All members will be elected by the Convention in the Annual Meeting. Members will be elected to a three-year term, one-third of their number retiring each year. No member can be elected to serve more than two full terms of office until at least one year will have elapsed after the second full term. A member may be elected to complete an unexpired term caused by vacancy and thereafter be elected to two full terms per above. In addition, the Executive Director will annually designate a Convention staff member as a consultant to this committee. Staff member succession will be at the discretion of the Executive Director.

The committee will elect a recording secretary and such other officers each year as it will deem necessary. The committee will meet quarterly and/or at such other times as will be designated by the chairperson.

The financial needs of the Christian Life and Public Affairs Committee will be through the budget of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware.

Article III • Avoidance of Illegal Action

No action of this Convention will be construed as authorizing its committees or related agencies to take any action that may be contrary to the law.

Article IV • General Mission Board

Section 1 — Meetings

The General Mission Board will have three regular meetings annually. Additional meetings may be called by the Administrative Committee.

Section 2—Officers

At the first meeting of the General Mission Board, annually after its election, there will be elected from the membership of the Board the following officers who will serve one year or until their successors are elected and qualified: President, Vice President, Recording Secretary, Assistant Recording Secretary.

Section 3—Work

The General Mission Board will serve as the corporate body and will have the power to act for this Convention in the interim between Annual Meetings except as specifically limited by the Constitution, or tasks committed to Boards of Trustees of its agencies. It will, therefore, be the purpose of the General Mission Board to promote and supervise such programs and activities as may be approved by the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware from time to time. It will have no power to contravene any action of this Convention nor to launch any new agencies. It may provide for the expansion of any phase of its work which its income and resources may make possible. The incumbent General Mission Board, its officers and committees will continue to function until the new General Mission Board, at its first meeting after the Annual Meeting of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, is duly organized. For the purpose of carrying out the mission of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, the Board

will elect an Executive Director and other staff in keeping with the needs, resources, and guidelines. All Convention employees will serve for an indefinite period of time.

The General Mission Board will recommend to this Convention the division of Cooperative Program gifts between the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware and Southern Baptist Convention and the division of funds among the objects of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware.

Section 4—Reports

The General Mission Board will make a full-year report to this Convention of its activities during the year. The Board will have its report printed and ready for distribution at the first session of the Annual Meeting, including reports from all other agencies of this Convention.

Section 5—Financial Review

The General Mission Board will employ a certified public accountant each year to review the books and accounts of the Treasurer. Annual reviews will be reported to the Board and printed in the minutes of this Convention.

Section 6—Committees

- 1. Nominating Committee—This committee will be composed of the Vice President of the General Mission Board, who will serve as chairperson, and four members appointed by the General Mission Board President. Should the Vice President not be able to serve on the Nominating Committee, the General Mission Board President will appoint another committee member and designate the chairperson. This committee will present nominations for General Mission Board officers and the chairperson and members of the Administrative Committee at its organizational meeting. Members of this committee cannot be nominated as members of the Administrative Committee.
- **2.** Administrative Committee Purpose—The Administrative Committee performs normal administrative committee responsibilities for the General Mission Board between regular meetings and works with the Executive Director in the implementation of the Board's policies, programs, and services assigned to its general care.
 - Membership—The Administrative Committee will be comprised of a chairperson, the
 President of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, the President of the General
 Mission Board, the past BCM/D President (one year), and one member from the geographic
 region of each association. The Executive Director and Associate Executive Director will
 serve as ex-officio members.
 - Responsibilities—The committee, in cooperation with the Executive Director and Associate
 Executive Director, will provide for the administering of the business and administrative
 affairs of the General Mission Board and for the monitoring of its Business and Financial
 Plan, including Stewardship Development and Cooperative Program Development. It will
 monitor the effectiveness of the services and programs of the General Mission Board,
 maintain employee policies and guidelines, serve as personnel committee, budget
 committee, perform committee functions for the General Mission Board and assist the
 Executive Director in accomplishing the purposes of the Board. The committee is
 responsible for an annual review of the Constitution and Bylaws of this Convention.

 Meetings—The Administrative Committee will meet at times specified by the General Mission Board and, if extra meetings are necessary, at times specified by the Executive Director and the chairperson of the Administrative Committee. An agenda will be jointly approved by the Executive Director and the chairperson and distributed at the meeting.

3. Ad Hoc Committees

Ad Hoc Committees will be appointed as needed by the president of the General Mission Board in consultation with the Administrative Committee chairperson and the Executive Director. Appointments will be reported to the General Mission Board at the next meeting.

4. Strategic Planning Teams

Strategic Planning Teams will report at each regular General Mission Board meeting. Strategies relating to budget and personnel matters must be approved by the General Mission Board.

Article V • Eligibility for Membership on Boards

Each member of the General Mission Board and trustees of any agency of this Convention will be a member, for at least twelve months preceding election, of one church which cooperates with this Convention.

The incumbent General Mission Board, its officers and committees, will continue to function until the new General Mission Board, at its first meeting during or after the Annual Meeting of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, is duly organized. The same is true for trustees and directors of any agency of this Convention.

Article VI • Procedure for the Annual Meeting

Section 1—Rules

- 1. The rules of order for the sessions of the Annual Meeting will be those in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order, but in cases where the meaning may not be clear, the President's discretion will be exercised. The President may appoint a Parliamentarian who will advise and assist the President with respect to all matters involving parliamentary procedure.
- 2. No person addressing the Annual Meeting may speak more than twice on the same subject without unanimous consent.
- 3. The President is charged at all times with the maintenance of decorum and order.
- 4. The President will only allow new business to be considered once during the Annual Meeting by permission of majority vote of the messengers present.

Section 2—Resolutions

All resolutions considered at the Annual Meeting will come from the Resolutions Committee and have their full consensus or, as a redress, one presented to but rejected by the committee may be ordered to the floor under a "question of privilege" without having the full consensus of the committee. All

resolutions available to the Resolutions Committee 45 days before the Annual Meeting will be automatically considered by the committee and, if accepted, will be printed and distributed at the first session of the Annual Meeting. If, in the opinion of the President, a messenger has a "copy-ready master" of a resolution with justifiable reason for not meeting the 45-day rule, it may be referred to the Resolutions Committee by the assembly at the first session. The action should follow the form: (Petitioner) "Mr. President, I request the consideration of a resolution concerning (subject)."; whereupon the President immediately puts the question without debate, "(Messenger) requests the privilege of having a late resolution considered, all who favor instructing the Resolutions Committee to review this resolution for consideration ... (vote)."

All resolutions passed at the Annual Meeting are the opinion of the overwhelming majority of the messengers present at that Annual Meeting but are not binding on the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, local associations, local congregations or individual Baptists. In order for a resolution to express the clear opinion of the messengers at the Annual Meeting, successful adoption will require an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the messengers present and voting.

Section 3—Election of Officers

- 1. The Officers of this Convention will be nominated from the floor, and the election will be by secret ballot when two or more persons are nominated for the same office.
 - The one receiving the majority of all votes will be declared elected.
 - The chairperson of the Credentials Committee hands the results of the vote to the presiding officer who announces first whether the vote is a majority vote or not. If a majority, the candidate is declared elected. If not a majority, the chairperson declares a run-off of the two receiving the highest number of votes.
 - The vote is not effective until announced.
- 2. The President will be elected before the Vice Presidents are nominated and the First Vice President is to be elected before receiving nominations for the Second Vice President.

Article VII • Amendments to Bylaws

The Bylaws may be altered by a majority vote of the messengers present at the Annual Meeting of this Convention. Non-substantive changes such as grammatical corrections and title or name changes may be made by the Administrative Committee of the General Mission Board and included in their report at the Annual Meeting of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware.

Section 2—Each member church meeting the requirements in Article III Section 1 will be entitled to two (2) messengers; each cooperating church exceeding fifty (50) members will then be given one additional messenger for each additional fifty (50) members or part thereof; or one additional messenger for each \$750 contributed to the work of this Convention through the Cooperative Program until the maximum of thirty (30) is reached.

The 186th Annual Meeting of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware

Theme: Mobilizing Churches for Mission

Session 1: Sunday Evening, November 6, 2022

Worship – Keasha Wormley and the worship team of Freedom Church led in worship.

Call to Order (Enrollment of Messengers)

Glenn Swanson, President of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, called the 186th Annual Meeting of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware to order. Theresa Sassard, Baltimore Baptist Association, Committee on Credentials and Enrollment reported there are 180 registered messengers and 38 guests for a total of 218 attendees.

Director of Mission Reports

Dan Sheffield of the Susquehanna Association which serves Harford and Cecil counties began his report by celebrating the Salaam Center in Baltimore. The Salaam Center is being supported by the association as well as several churches, including Pleasant View Baptist Church. He also shared of two missionaries to Hungary and exhorted the convention to pray for them. Lastly, he requested prayers for Disaster Relief and Church Planting.

Kenny Heath of the Western Association shared his report via video. He celebrated the Disaster Relief opportunities within the association. He also shared about helping churches who have struggled to sustain as well as opportunities for campus ministry at Frostburg State. Lastly, he shared of his personal involvement and opportunities to serve at the local Farm Bureau and local theater.

Dave Aubrey of the Delaware Association also shared his report via video. He spoke of growth in church partnerships for local community events. He stated that this shows the importance of being on the same team. He requested prayer for helping to provide pulpit supply as well as music and staffing needs of local churches. The Delaware Association is currently sponsoring ten individuals in their call to ministry with prayer and finances. Lastly, he requested prayer to be faithful in word and in deed, increase their witness in the community, and joyfully declare the Gospel.

President's Address - Glenn Swanson

BCM/D President Glenn Swanson began his address with personal thanks for all of the Director of Missions serving the local associations in the BCM/D. President Swanson reminded all

attending that Jesus is essential! Colossians 3:1-4 point us to the centrality of Jesus and Paul stated that we must put Christ as the center. He also shared that he believes that the greatest celebrations happen when an unsaved person comes to know Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior. Stating that there is no greater joy than to know that there is no one without hope, he encouraged all to put Christ at the center of everything. He stated that this starts with prayer and that it has been a joy to see the churches of the BCM/D lead in prayer.

Church Planting Celebration

Jamie Caldwell, Church Planting Team Leader, celebrated his gratitude for all of the churches within the BCM/D that start churches. He encouraged all to keep giving, doing good, praying, and sending.

Church Services Celebration

Mark Dooley, Church Services Team Leader, commended the churches for their creativity and hard work. He also shared a desire to be more relational and collaborative with affiliated churches.

Skycroft Conference Center Celebration

Emily Reedy, Camp Director, shared that they see 18,000 guests annually on their 350-acre property. Skycroft is currently celebrating their 50th anniversary. Reedy stated that this year they had 1900 campers during their 7 weeks of summer camp which is more than prepandemic numbers. She also celebrated 49 professions of faith, 25 baptisms, and 97 group events. God is doing a good work at Skycroft!

Worship – Keasha Wormley and the worship team of Freedom Church led in worship.

Director of Mission Reports

Keith Myer of the Eastern Association celebrated the association of churches that he considers as family. He shared that 48% of the association's budget is now dedicated toward mission work and he is thrilled for the greater partnership and grant opportunities, including disaster relief work in Puerto Rico. He also asked for prayer that they would discover new ways to encourage, connect and support churches and that the Lord would send workers into His harvest field.

Greg Kame of the Arundel Association expressed his gratitude for the wisdom that God has given as healthy pastors lead healthy churches. He shared about pastoral scholarship assistance that has created opportunities for pastors to go to Skycroft Conference Center to spend time praying and connecting with the Lord. He also shared a desire for pastors to think beyond the walls of their local church in order to find innovative ways to do ministry in the local church. Kame requested prayer for the inactive churches within the association to see the beauty of working together.

Jeremy Dickson of the Baltimore Association celebrated the 93rd meeting as an association where he was newly appointed as Director of Mission. He shared that the association was able

to give away over \$70,000 in grants to affiliated churches. Dickson also shared of B Students, a youth group serving over 22 churches and 135 students in the Baltimore region led by Matt Robinson. Finally, he ended by requesting prayer for a re-engagement of pastors and churches.

Oldest and Youngest Pastor Testimonies – Mark Dooley

Mark Dooley celebrated several pastors over the age of 80 years old but highlighted the pastor of Berean Baptist Church, Willie Lampley Jr who is 88. He is celebrating over 40 years as a pastor and provided some thoughts via video. When asked what advise he had for young pastors, Lampley shared that he learned to not worry about success. He shared that the only failure is failure in obedience. To the question of one thing he still wants to accomplished, he replied that he wants to leave the spirit of unity found in Ephesians 4:3 with the community. For a prayer request, Lampley asked that he would "know the Lord and be able to serve while I'm in this life."

Dooley then introduced Richard Pope, pastor of Canvas Church in Salisbury as the youngest pastor in the convention at 25 years old, as well as his wife Payton. When asked one way that older pastors have encouraged him, Pope shared that he has been encouraged to rest, lead and serve with a cheerful heart. Also to continue to do the work, even when it's hard because the work and the people are worth it. Payton added that she has been encouraged to surround herself with people who speak the truth of God. Pope shared that what he is looking forward to most in 2023 is seeing what God will do in the new building space that they are moving into. Their prayer is that one more — and one more and one more — person will be saved. When asked how the convention can pray specifically, Pope requested that people would pray that his cancer would be healed and that Payton's joy would be in Jesus.

Salaam Center – Reda Narouz

Reda Narouz shared that his family originally came to America because of his daughter's brain tumor but they have stayed because of a heart for Muslim people. The Salaam Center serves more than 300 families and brings the hope of the Gospel. They prayed for a building and the Lord provided.

Celebration Testimonies

Katie Matthews, Executive Director of the Banquet Network, presented the history of the Banquet Network. She shared that only 5-10% of churches are equipped to reach individuals and families with disabilities.

Victor Kirk represented the African American Fellowship and shared of the George Liele Leadership Institute. The aim of the institute is to connect African American churches and pastors to form partnerships.

Somer Phoebus and Melody Knox who serve as minister's wives consultants on staff celebrated a new initiative for ministers wives and shared of several events that will occur in the beginning of 2023.

Mini Message - Jeremy Dickson

Jeremy Dickson, pastor of Freedom Church, encouraged all attenders from Hebrews 6:10. He stated that though it has been a hard two and a half years due to the pandemic, politics and social issues, we should remain unified. He stated that we should keep going because God is not unjust. God sees our hard work and nothing compares to hearing "well done, my good and faithful servant."

Worship – Keasha Wormley and the worship team of Freedom Church led in worship.

Fellowship Time

Session 2: Monday Morning, November 7, 2022

Call to Order (Enrollment of Messengers)

Glenn Swanson called second to order. Theresa Sassard, Baltimore Baptist Association, Committee on Credentials and Enrollment reported there are 253 registered messengers and 55 guests for a total of 308 attendees.

Worship – Keasha Wormley and the worship team of Freedom Church led in worship.

Mini Message – Dan Hyun

Dan Hyun, pastor of Village Church Hampden, shared of the importance and intimacy of prayer. As children who have been adopted in the family of God we pray to a loving daddy. Hyun stated that prayer is a means to pray to our daddy for stuff as well as for the purpose of showing greater intimacy. He also shared that Spirit-led prayer reminds us of hope when we feel we have nothing left. The goal is not the substance of the prayer but a reminder of who that we pray to.

Director of Mission Reports

Larry Steen of the Mid-Maryland Association celebrated his fiftieth wedding anniversary and his first great grandson. He also shared that he will be retiring this year and John Mackall at Crosslife Church will assume the position of Director of Mission. He shared of a minister and spouses annual banquet that is sponsored by a family in the association as well as a prospective church plant. He requested prayer for his wife as she is facing the possibility of back surgery in 2023.

Marcus Tillman of the Prince George's Association began by celebrating the final purchase of their building. He also praised God for several active ministries in the association as well as a partnership with Lancaster Bible Church. He requested pray that the churches would become what he called 3-T churches – time, talents and treasures.

Fred Caudle of the Potomac Association introduced Kay Caudle as the administrator. Caudle shared of a strong desire to share the Gospel. He celebrated that their God-sized ministry and God-sized opportunity provided \$10,000 in direct mission scholarships. He also shared of a strategy that would see their churches FORTified – Fellowship, Opportunity, Resource and Training.

Ellen Udovich, Church and Community Consultant at the BCM/D, shared an encouraging story of a small church in central Maryland that was READY to meet needs when a crisis happened. She shared that life-changing impact is made when churches are able to move quickly and powerfully.

Christian Life and Public Affairs Committee – Chris McCombs

Chris McCombs, Pastor of Lexington Park Baptist Church, shared that he is looking forward to expanding the ministry of the CLPA. He celebrated an active team that desires to promote life, marriage and family. McCombs stated that he believes that the CLPA can make a difference for our culture.

Business Session

Glenn Swanson opened the business session with the nominations for offices.

Election of Officers

Rev. Rick Hancock, pastor of Emmanuel Baptist Church, nominated Glenn Swanson, pastor of Bayside Baptist Church, for the office of BCM/D President. No other nominations were made; therefore, the Recording Secretary was instructed to cast the single ballot of the BCM/D messengers for Rev. Glenn Swanson as President of the BCM/D. Jim Testerman was nominated and received as 1st Vice President. Vernon Lattimore was nominated and received as 2nd Vice President. Stephanie Greer was nominated and received as Recording Secretary. Mike Fillis was nominated and received as Assistant Recording Secretary. Rick Hancock led in a prayer of blessing.

Swanson proceeded to the President's committee appointments, which according to the Bylaws, the President appoints the following committees: Committee on Committees, Committee on Resolutions, and the Committee on Credentials and Enrollment, which are listed below.

Approval of Order of Business

Swanson presented the Order of Business. The motion was made to adopt the Order of Business agenda for the 186th Annual Meeting of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware. The messengers unanimously approved the agenda.

Introduction of New Business

Keith Myer of Harvest Baptist Church proposed an amendment to Article 2, Section 2 to include the following sentence: "The committee member of each association will consult with the Director of Mission of that association, to solicit names for recommendation to the General Mission Board or for vacancy on a convention agency's board of trustees." The motion was submitted to the Constitution and Bylaws Committee for consideration.

Baptist Foundation Report – Tom Stolle on behalf of Stacey Boyles

Baptist Foundation of Maryland Delaware currently manages assets of approximately \$11.9 million. Through the Church Loan program, 18 churches affiliated with the BCM/D are being assisted, with approximately \$2.6 million dollars in outstanding loans. The Foundation makes a distribution annually to the BCM/D to be used to start churches and strengthen existing churches. The distribution to be made for the fiscal year ended September 30, 2022, totals \$116,950.37, which was presented to the BCM/D.

An additional investment option exists via our partnership with the Kentucky Baptist Foundation, offering BCM/D affiliated churches a low-risk investment alternative to traditional money market and savings accounts.

Executive Director Address

"When we come together, we experience something we can't get by ourselves." Michael Crawford, Executive Director, began his address by giving a definition of vision as what you see when you close your eyes. He stated that his vision is that every church to is mobilized for mission. He went on to define a mobilized church as one that makes new disciples, loves each other, loves their community, develops service and is intentional about stewarding the body. Crawford believes that mobilized church are senders. He shared a desire to resource our churches so that everyone knows how to mobilize their churches. The BCM/D has allocated \$110,000 for further partnerships with our associations as we believe that the health of our convention rests on the health of our associations.

Crawford ended his address with some notes to the budget which would be presented to the messengers by Tom Stolle. He noted that in an effort to start and strengthen churches locally, there is a reduction of national cooperative program giving. He also noted additional budget dollars for connections with pastors and loving pastors wives, the African American Fellowship, ministerial counseling and the protection of children and vulnerable adults. He shared that he believes all of these practically support the vision of the BCM/D.

Tom Stolle, Associate Executive Director and CFO, presented the 2023 budget to the messengers. Stolle noted that partnership was highlighted throughout the budget. Greater grant opportunities for local associations were incorporated in the budget. The State Missions Offering also moved to a grant program with 100% of the funds going back to the local churches. Additionally, the percentage of funds designated for SBC was reduced from 48% to 37% to allow us to strengthen and more effectively partner with our local associations, invest more in Maryland/Delaware church plants, and fortify our strengthening efforts for existing churches.

General Mission Board Report – President Byron Day

Byron Day recommended the approval of the 2023 Proposed Budget.

Mark Dooley then honored several long-tenured pastors, including Steve Hokuf, who is the longest serving pastor at 42 years. Iris White and Randy Millwood were also honored after retiring this year. Andrew Goins and Alejandro were honored for their migrant work. Jamie Caldwell, Church Planting Team Leader, then lead the room through corporate prayer before breaking for lunch.

Session 3: Monday Afternoon, November 7, 2022

Worship – Keasha Wormley and the worship team of Freedom Church led in worship.

Director of Mission Reports

Bruce Conley of the Blue Ridge Association began by expressing his gratitude for the ability to serve as director of mission for the past 15 years. He shared about several teams that were sent out of the association to the Dominican Republic in conjunction with Operation Christmas Child. Conley also celebrated a three-year partnership with Calvary Baptist in West Virginia. He stated that they have dedicated groups of volunteers and are actively involved in Disaster Relief. Finally, Conley ended by asking for prayer for wisdom as well as his own physical health.

Ron Blankenship of the Montgomery Association shared that he has served as the association's director of mission for 23 years. He then celebrated many churches that he said were on mission in fellowship in the kingdom for Jesus Christ. He also celebrated that the Lord has more than doubling the amount of churches in the association, which he said was through starting churches. He shared of a church body-building conference as well as a spring revival that would take place next year. Blankenship is excited that ESL ministries are thriving as well as a seminary extension being offered and desires to move forward to encourage leaders.

Sexual Abuse Task Force Report

The Sexual Abuse Task Force report was presented by members Dr. Bergina Isbell, Kris Buckman, Keith Myer, and Brad O'Brien. Collectively, they spoke of the importance of protecting people from those who would use others for their own purpose. They also shared that their burden as a task force is to help member churches implement a solid prevention and protection plan that preserves the good name of Jesus. Pathways prevention and protection cards were distributed on the seat of every messenger and guest.

Mini Message – Joel Rainey

Joel Rainer, pastor of Covenant Church in West Virginia, shared a message about Romans 16:21-23. He stated that in a world with polarization, the church is unifying. He noted that Paul

thanked God for their unity and that everyone named in the passage is called by their Savior. He encouraged all to remember others by their service and love them in Christ.

Business Session

Keith Myer, chair of the Resolutions Committee, shared the first resolution which was in appreciation for the Ocean City Fontainebleau Resort for hosting the meeting and to all the people who served us today.

On Appreciation for Ocean City Fontainebleau Resort

WHEREAS, The messengers to the 186th session of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware are celebrating our cooperation together in a time of worship, encouragement, and fellowship in the Lord Jesus Christ; and

WHEREAS, We acknowledge the goodness of God in supplying us with all of these blessings; and

WHEREAS, We acknowledge the hard work and excellent service provided by the Ocean City Fontainebleau Resort, hosting us with professionalism; and

WHEREAS, We also acknowledge the hard work of the BCM/D executive team and their efforts in planning and communication, and all the time and attention of the BCM/D staff invested in making this meeting possible, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the messengers to the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware meeting in Ocean City, Maryland, November 6-7, 2022, express our thankfulness to our gracious God and Savior and to all those through whom He is working to bring about an annual meeting characterized by prayer, humility, friendship, encouragement, vision, and increased cooperation.

The resolution was approved.

Constitution and Bylaws Committee

Fred Caudle, chair of the Constitution and Bylaws Committee, presented constitution changes on behalf of the entire committee.

Article 3 Membership: Caudle presented the second reading to update purpose to mission and affirm the Baptist Faith & Message 2000.

Section 1—The membership of this Convention will consist of messengers who are members of Baptist churches which are in friendly cooperation with this Convention and sympathetic with its purpose mission and work, affirm the Baptist Faith & Message 2000, and which have during the

preceding 12 months (October 1 through September 30) been bona fide contributors to the work of this Convention.

The proposed changes were approved.

Article 3 Membership: Caudle presented the second reading addressing the minimum contribution.

Each affiliated church must make a minimum contribution of \$500.00 annually during the preceding 12 months (October 1 through September 30). If the church does not contribute the minimum annual amount, they have until the end of the following 12 months (October 1 through September 30) to meet their current and prior year minimum.

After much discussion, there was a motion to table the recommendation and the motion passed.

Article 3 Membership: Caudle presented the second reading specifying the number of messengers granted to each affiliated church.

Section 2—Each cooperating member church meeting the requirements in Article III Section 1 will be entitled to two (2) messengers; each cooperating church exceeding fifty (50) members will then be given one additional messenger for each additional fifty (50) members or part thereof; or one additional messenger for each \$750 contributed to the work of this Convention through the Cooperative Program until the maximum of thirty (30) is reached.

The proposed changes were approved.

Article 6 General Mission Board: Caudle presented the second reading to replace Maryland with Maryland/Delaware.

Section 2—The President of this Convention, the President of the Woman's Missionary Union and the Maryland/Delaware member of the Southern Baptist Convention Executive Committee will serve as at-large members of the Board.

The proposed changes were approved.

Article 7 Agencies: Caudle presented the second reading regarding BaptistLIFE.

Section 5—Proposals for the establishment of new agencies must follow one of the following procedures: (1) Authority may be granted upon favorable vote by two successive Annual Meetings, or (2) Authority may be granted by vote of one Annual Meeting provided a favorable recommendation is made by the General Mission Board, after thorough study, and provided further that the proposal has been published in two issues of BaptistLIFE is published online 45 days before the Annual Meeting or in such other ways as the General Mission Board may direct.

The proposed changes were approved.

Article 9 The Denominational Paper: Caudle presented the second reading also regarding BaptistLIFE.

Section 2—The General Mission Board of this Convention will be responsible for the conduct of this phase of our work through the Director of the Communication Center Executive Director.

The proposed changes were approved.

Article 3 Membership: Caudle expressed the need to add language to our constitution in order to protect the vulnerable.

Section 1—<u>In order to be affiliated with the BCMD, a local church must seek to protect vulnerable adults and children from sexual abuse in concrete ways which reflect the spirit and theology of Scripture.</u>

After much discussion, the proposed changes were approved.

Article 3 Membership: Caudle expressed the need to add language to our constitution to define disaffiliation of membership.

Section 1—Membership will cease Disaffiliation of Membership will occur in the following: when Baptist churches are no longer either in friendly cooperation with this convention and sympathetic with its mission and work, no longer affirm the Baptist Faith & Message 2000, or which have not during the preceding 12 months (October 1 through September 30) been bona fide contributors to the work of this Convention, or Disaffiliation of a church will occur when a church is found to be in open and unrepentant beliefs or behaviors that are contrary to the BF&M 2000.

The proposed changes were approved.

Mini Message – Richard Pope

Richard Pope, pastor of Canvas Church in Salisbury, MD, shared a message acknowledging that we are born into a broken world that is marred by sin. Using several passages, he encouraged all to acknowledge that we suffer, acknowledge that Jesus suffered, and exhorted us to suffer like Jesus suffered. Pope ended by reminding us to wait in faithful obedience because the King is good at His Word.

Adjournment - President Glenn Swanson announced the 186th meeting of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware is now adjourned. He closed with a benediction from Colossians 3.

Report of Executive Director Michael Crawford

Welcome to the 186th BCM/D Annual Meeting. I am so happy you are here to worship God and celebrate what He has done through our churches. I want to take a moment and look at where we are and where we are going!

X Marks the Spot

Have you ever seen an "X" on a map that says "You Are Here?" Well, here's where I think the "X" is for the BCM/D. We are in a good place to continue to accomplish the things we have not been able to do in the past. We have the staff to do it. We have the collaboration as a two-state convention with our eleven partnering associations to do it. We have a national partnership to do it. And we have God's blessing. We should be grateful that we are in this position. Not all state conventions have been able to say that and to be where we are.

We're also in a time of transition—we are trying to build on what we have to pursue. Listed here are just some of the blessings God has provided to us. We have the beginnings of a strategic and measurable partnership with our associations, which means we are communicating more than we ever have, and we are more unified. The BCM/D is now more invested in our partnering associations than ever before. We have an incredible staff that is able to serve our churches and help mobilize them for mission. We have Skycroft Conference Center, which, though in the process of rebounding from the pandemic, amazingly saw some of the largest camp attendance we've had this summer — more than in pre-pandemic 2019! And this fall, bookings for ReBoot are almost full, and 2023 Centrikid is already sold out. We are now working to secure Skycroft's long-term sustainability and effectiveness. We have a passion for and are positioned to effectively reach marginalized people groups that encompass individuals with disabilities and migrants. We are recognized by other state conventions as leaders, being on the cutting edge, with the work of our sexual abuse task force in training and developing systems designed to protect children and vulnerable adults. Our national strategic partnerships have never been stronger with Send Network and Send Relief. We are on the cusp of having our first Send Relief Center in Brooklyn at the Transformation Center, which will be a hub for multiple churches to be equipped and resourced to serve their communities. Additionally, our budget is better positioned to resource our mission and strategies.

Where Are We Going?

To me, vision is what you see when you close your eyes and when I close my eyes, I imagine every church mobilized for mission.

What does that look like? A mobilized church makes new disciples, is committed to prayer, loves one another, loves their community, develops servant leaders, and sends out church planters and missionaries. And we want every single church in our collective to be a mobilized church. We're also moving toward the position of being "BCM/D Ready." Community Engagement Consultant Ellen Udovich is working with all our associations to coordinate, equip and resource them, so each association has 25 trained volunteers, resourced and organized to respond to both natural disasters and acute community needs.

Where we're going in terms of staff is becoming more relational. We believe everything rises and falls on relationships, and we want to excel in getting to know and build relationships with pastors, wives, and churches more than we ever have in the past. We want to continue to ensure our pastors have the support, resources, and equipping they need to do God's will and also that their wives feel seen, heard, affirmed, equipped, and cared for.

And I would also say we would like to have the largest disability camp in the United States, and we will move in that direction. We will assess our budget each year and continually reposition it so we can more effectively resource our mission.

Here is what I want you to experience at this Annual Meeting

I want you to experience hearing what God has done and is doing and glorify Him because of it. And I want you to be glad that you are a part of it and play some role in what God is doing in our collective. We're going to do a lot of celebrating, and you will be happy to see and hear what God is doing. And you will experience clear communication about what we are doing, our plans, and how we will get there regarding our budget and future. I want you to know that collaboration is so important because our primary value is experienced when we are on mission together, sharing our resources. There are things individual churches can do, but there are things we can do as a collective that individual churches can't do.

We hope you are so joyful about what God is doing in and through Maryland/ Delaware churches that you will leave excited about being a part of our BCM/D collective and where we are going. I am.

2021-2022 Summarized Activities/Highlights of the General Mission Board

The General Mission Board (GMB) is pleased to serve the churches within our Convention.

The 2023 budget referred by the GMB to the messengers includes a commitment to send 37% of Cooperative Program (CP) receipts to the Southern Baptist Convention (SBC), reflecting our desire to allocate a significant portion to national and international missions causes. Note that while the budget includes a reduction in the percentage of CP receipts sent out of the region from 48% to 37%, this shift allows us to directly allocate \$100,000 additional dollars to Maryland/Delaware church planting efforts, infuse \$100,000 into cooperating local Baptist associations, and significantly increase our budgeted commitment to church strengthening efforts here at home. Budgeted funding for church strengthening efforts includes budgeted funds for ministries we value, such as connecting with pastors and their wives, disability ministry, crisis care, ministerial counseling, youth and children, protection of the vulnerable, and BCM/D Ready which includes Disaster Relief. We can accomplish all of this while still making a significant investment through our national partners in national and international missions.

The budget forecasts \$3.4 million in Cooperative Program receipts in 2023. This budget also includes an exciting redirection in the focus of our annual State Missions Offering (SMO). In 2023, SMO will be a grant program, with every dollar collected available for grants going back to Maryland/Delaware churches to assist in mobilizing these churches for mission.

Concerning Skycroft Conference Center, this budget reflects the anticipation of a full pandemic recovery, serving thousands of guests as well as ministering to more than 2,000 students attending the various on-site camps. Skycroft Conference Center remains a vital part of church strengthening and evangelistic ministry. Many campers make decisions for Christ through the ministry of Skycroft. Maximizing the development of Skycroft through expanded guest services, focus on development, and connection with the community is vital to its long-term success. To that end, the addition of a Skycroft Sales and Development Director is budgeted for 2023. The GMB will continue to assess Skycroft, recognizing its significant contribution to BCM/D ministry while evaluating the investment of resources and strategic use of the property moving forward.

The repair/replacement project of the Skycroft septic system continues. A hydrogeological study required by the State of Maryland has been completed. Soon, the State of Maryland will communicate to us the future direction of the project and system design requirements based on the collected data.

In March 2022, the GMB called Michael Crawford to serve as the Executive Director of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware (BCM/D). I thank the executive search committee for their diligence in conducting this search. I also thank Mark Dooley for faithfully serving as Interim Executive Director until Michael assumed the role.

A Sexual Abuse Task Force was established to

emphasize to affiliated churches the vital importance of protecting children and vulnerable adults from abuse. The work of this committee has resulted in multiple training events throughout our convention, as well as a recommended change to the BCM/D Constitution that is being presented for a first reading at this annual meeting. The GMB is pleased to recommend this change to our governing documents, which emphasizes our commitment to the protection of the vulnerable.

The Communications Department was reorganized. Megan Jones was added to BCM/D staff as communications director, replacing the former Creative Director, Reggie Davis, who relocated to Kentucky. Dominic Henry was added to managing the onsite studio, as well as responsible for video and podcast production.

In preparation for this annual meeting, the first ever BCM/D Town Hall was held in September. We presented proposed changes to our governing documents that will be presented at this meeting and provided other information so that our messengers could arrive to the annual meeting more informed. More than 400 churches choose to affiliate with the BCM/D to cooperatively share Jesus. We can do much more together than we can apart. INDEPENDENT ACCOUNTANT'S REVIEW REPORT

To the General Mission Board of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, Inc.

We have reviewed the accompanying financial statements of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, Inc. (a Nonprofit Organization), which comprise the statement of assets, liabilities and net assets – cash receipts and disbursement basis as of December 31, 2022, and the related statements of budgeted activities – cash receipts and disbursement basis for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements. A review includes primarily applying analytical procedures to management's financial data and making inquiries of management. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit, the objective of which is the expression of an opinion regarding the financial statements as a whole. Accordingly, we do not express such an opinion.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with the cash receipts and disbursement basis of accounting; this includes determining that the cash receipts and disbursement basis of accounting is an acceptable basis for the preparation of financial statements in the circumstances. Our responsibility is to conduct the review engagement in accordance with Statements on Standards for Accounting and Review Services promulgated by the Accounting and Review Services Committee of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. Those standards require us to perform procedures to obtain limited assurance as a basis for reporting whether we are aware of any material modifications that should be made to the financial statements for them to be in accordance with the cash receipts and disbursement basis of accounting. We believe that the results of our procedures provide a reasonable basis for our conclusion.

We are required to be independent of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, Inc. and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements related to our review.

Accountant's Conclusion

Based on our review, we are not aware of any material modifications that should be made to the accompanying financial statements in order for them to be in accordance with the cash receipts and disbursements basis of accounting.

Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to the notes to the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the cash receipts and disbursement basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Our conclusion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Note 1 – <u>Summary of Significant Accounting Policies</u>

Date of Management Review: Management has evaluated subsequent events through February 14, 2023, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued. The Organization did not have any material recognizable subsequent events during this period.

Organizational Purpose: As stated by the mission statement of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, Inc. (the "Organization"), it will intentionally assist the starting and strengthening of congregations so that together they can fulfill Jesus' commands in Matthew 28:19-20 and Acts 1:8. The Organization derives the majority of their income from individuals and churches in Maryland and Delaware.

Basis of Accounting: These statements are presented on the cash receipts and disbursements basis. The cash receipts and disbursements basis require that revenues and the related assets be recognized when received rather than when earned, and certain expenses be recognized when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred. However, these financial statements have been modified to reflect certain items budgeted for 2022 even through the actual funds related to those items have not been received or expended as of December 31, 2022. The statement of budgeted activities – cash receipts and disbursement basis reports only those transactions that were budgeted for in 2022.

Funds received by the Organization to be used for purposes unrelated to the operating activities of the Organization are recorded as a cash exchange liability until such funds have been disbursed.

Financial Statement Presentation: The Organization has adopted the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Updated (ASU) 2016-14, "Not-for-Profit Entities (Topic 958): Presentation of Financial Statements of Not-for-Profit Entities." Under ASU 2016-14, the Organization is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to the following two classes of net assets:

Without Donor Restrictions

Net assets which are free of donor-imposed restrictions. Included net assets are donor advised funds, for which donors may make recommendations to the Board of Trustees with respect to the distribution of the income and/or principal for an agreed upon period of time. The Board of Trustees has complete discretion on whether to accept or reject the donor's recommendation.

With Donor Restrictions

The Organization reports gifts of cash and other assets as restricted support if they are received with donor or grantor stipulations that limit the use of the donated assets. Some donor-imposed restrictions are temporary in nature, such as those that will be met by the passage of time or other specified events. When time or purpose restrictions expire, or are achieved, the net assets are reclassified to net assets without donor restrictions. Other restrictions are perpetual in nature, where resources are to be maintained in perpetuity.

The Organization has adopted the FASB issued ASU 2018-13, "Fair Value Measurement (Topic 820): Disclosure Framework – Changes to the Disclosure Requirements for Fair Value Measurement." The standards core principle is to improve the effectiveness of disclosures in the notes to the financial statements.

Cash and Cash Equivalents: Cash and cash equivalents include all monies in banks and highly liquid debt instruments that mature in 90 days or less available for use to meet the needs for general expenditures within one year of the balance sheet date.

Other Current Assets: Other current assets consist of inventories and prepaid expenses. Inventories are stated at the lower of cost or market using the first-in, first-out (FIFO) method. Inventory consists of various supplies on hand needed for the operations of the Organization.

Note 1 – <u>Summary of Significant Accounting Policies</u> (continued)

Property Owned: Property and equipment that have been capitalized are stated at cost. Assets purchased in excess of \$2,500 which have a useful life in excess of one year, are capitalized. Major additions and betterments are charged to the asset accounts only to the extent the costs have been reflected in the operating budget. Management periodically reviews the utilization of assets and removes those assets that no longer have a useful life. Depreciation is not recorded since the operating budget makes no provision for non-cash expenses; accordingly, an impairment loss from the valuation of long-lived assets under FASB Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820 would not be recorded.

Cooperative Giving: The Organization adopted FASB ASC 958-605, "Not-for-Profit Entities – Revenue Recognition." In accordance with FASB ASC 958-605, contributions received are recorded without donor restrictions or with donor restrictions support depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor restrictions. Promises to give are not recorded as cooperative giving until the funds are received.

Investments and Investment Income: The Organization elected to adopt FASB ASC 958-320, "Not-for-Profit Entities – Investments – Debt & Equity Securities." Under FASB ASC 958-320, investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities are valued at their fair values in the statement of financial position.

Investments, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. It is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments could occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statement of financial position.

Investments held at the Baptist Foundation of Maryland/Delaware, Inc. are available to meet the needs for general expenditures of the Organization.

Liquidity: All cash and receivables of the organization are available to meet general expenditures within one year of the balance sheet date.

Income Taxes: The Organization is exempt from Federal taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Organization is required to file a return to report unrelated business income generated at the Skycroft Convention Center. At December 31, 2022 the provision for unrelated business income tax was \$0. The Organization's Federal tax returns generally stay open to examination for three years from the filing date.

Estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the modified cash receipts and disbursements method used by the Organization, requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the reported period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Note 2 – Cash and Cash Equivalents

The Organization maintains its cash accounts at various financial institutions and its balances may at times exceed the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) insured limits. The Organization has not experienced any losses in such accounts and monitors the creditworthiness of the financial institutions with which it conducts business. Management believes that the Organization is not exposed to any significant credit risk with respect to its cash balances.

Note 3 – <u>Baptist Foundation of Maryland/Delaware, Inc.</u>

This account represents funds transferred to the Baptist Foundation of Maryland/Delaware, Inc., which is the agency designated for the management of trust funds. Income earned from these funds is returned to the Organization or its designated agencies.

Note 4 – Investments and Fair Value Measurements

The Organization accounts for the fair value of its investments under the Fair Value Measurement and Disclosure topic of the FASB ASC, which provides the framework for measuring fair value. The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurement) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurement). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under this guidance are described as follows:

Level 1

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Organization has the ability to access.

Level 2

Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets, quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets, inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability, and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and maximize the use of unobservable inputs.

There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2022. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from, and relates directly to, the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements.

The Organization's financial instruments, none of which are held for trading purposes, include cash, marketable securities, and notes receivable. The Organization estimates that fair value of all financial instruments at December 31, 2022 does not differ materially from the aggregate carrying values of its financial instruments recorded in these statements. The estimated fair value amounts have been determined by the Organization using available market and appropriate valuation methodologies. Considerable judgment is necessarily required in interpreting market data to develop the estimates of fair value, and accordingly, the estimates are not necessarily indicative of the amounts that the Organization could realize in a current market exchange.

Note 6 – Retirement Plan

The Organization provides a tax qualified retirement plan for the benefit of eligible employees. Employees become eligible within six months of their starting date, with contributions equaling 10% of current year compensation. The plan is designated to provide employees with an accumulation of funds for retirement on a tax-deferred basis and provides for annual discretionary contributions. The expense was \$128,627 for the year ending December 31, 2022.

Note 7 – Related Party Transactions

The Organization provides the services of their employees to the Baptist Foundation of Maryland/Delaware, Inc. Investment income and administrative fees paid by the Baptist Foundation of Maryland/Delaware, Inc. support the administrative costs incurred by the Organization. Distributions received from the Baptist Foundation of Maryland/Delaware, Inc. were \$538,300 for the year ended December 31, 2022, which are included in receipts on the statement of budgeted activities – cash receipts and disbursement basis. Total management fees received from the Baptist Foundation of Maryland/Delaware, Inc. were \$34,131 for the year ended December 31, 2022, which are included in cash exchange on the statement of assets, liabilities and net assets – cash receipts and disbursement basis.

Note 8 – Skycroft Conference Center and Note Payable

Owned and operated by the Organization, Skycroft is located on over 341 acres in Frederick County, Maryland. The center opened in 1977 to offer the opportunity to slip away into a quiet spot to reflect, to be re-created, to be refreshed in the beauty of "God's great outdoors."

On December 30, 2016, the Organization purchased approximately 41 additional acres of land to add to Skycroft for a purchase price of \$325,000. The Organization obtained a note payable in the principal amount of \$276,250, secured by the land, to partially fund the purchase. The note payable requires monthly payments of principal and interest in the amount of \$2,036. The note payable bears interest at a rate of 3.89% per year and matures in December 2031. Interest incurred and paid on the note payable was \$8,320 for the year ended December 31, 2022.

Convention Finance/Operations

Finance Office

The finance office, like most finance and accounting operations, records cash receipts, pays vendors, produces financial statements, and provides financial information to both management and staff. However, the finance office of the BCM/D goes far beyond these internal processes. We also minister to Maryland/Delaware Baptists in other ways.

One method of ministry is through education. We offer a variety of training opportunities that may benefit your church. One of our most popular training opportunities provided is the annual ministers' tax seminar. This seminar benefits not only church treasurers but also pastors as they learn more about current regulations that help them improve their individual tax planning and preparation.

Another helpful learning opportunity available is a planned giving seminar. It is a joy to share information with Christ followers that assists them in planning not only for their financial future but also their children's future and the future of their local church. Financial stewardship seminars continue to be made available to our churches, presenting biblical principles for money management.

Multiple churches have participated in seminars providing helpful information to church pastors, treasurers, and other church leaders concerning establishing and maintaining systems of internal control, including the safeguarding of church assets. No church wants to be a victim of fraud or embezzlement. We provide training on how a church can better protect itself against these threats. Other topics, such as preparing a church budget and insurance issues facing churches, are available. These training opportunities have proven to be valuable to our churches. Meetings with individual churches are scheduled on request. These requested meetings are routinely available throughout the year to assist our churches with these and other important issues.

Beyond the scope of finance office day-to-day operations, seminars, and individual church training on various financial and operational topics, the finance office provides accounting and financial services to a local Baptist association, the Baptist Foundation of MD/DE, and the Rivers Corporate Park condominium association (an association that includes the BCM/D as a member).

It is imperative that we continue to educate our churches about the value and purpose of the Cooperative Program and how we can do more together than we can apart. The finance office works closely with our communications team to emphasize the importance of church participation in giving through the Cooperative Program. We are better together, and the Cooperative Program allows us as Maryland/Delaware Baptists to have a powerful comprehensive missions and ministry impact.

Baptist Center

The facility staff continues to search for ways to make the operation of the Baptist Center in Columbia, Maryland more efficient and its presentation to guests more aesthetically pleasing while being good stewards of the facility God has blessed us with.

Did you know that we have a studio in our facility where we record BCM/D videos and podcasts? If your church would like access to this studio for production of its own videos or podcasts, feel free to contact our Communications Department.

Skycroft Conference Center

We're celebrating our 50th anniversary at Skycroft this year. The Lord has richly blessed us during this special milestone year!

After sparser attendance for months following the pandemic, 2022 has been a tremendous rebound year. To date we have hosted nearly 12,000 guests for more than 200 group retreats and events compared to 5,500 guests in 2021.

We had an incredible summer where we hosted 1,906 attendees across seven weeks of our camp programs – Crossings (6th-12th graders) and Centrikid (2nd-6th graders) – more campers than we had in 2019, our last summer unaffected by COVID! Forty-nine campers made professions of faith in Christ at camp this summer, in addition to the 80 spiritual milestones decisions reported! These milestone decisions include decisions for baptism, rededication and even calling into ministry. Praise God!

And that's just seven weeks of summer camp! Think of the hundreds of people of all ages that come to Skycroft every week of the year. Many more could share their own testimonies of how the Lord did a work in them during their time at Skycroft, whether it be through weekend Bible study, time devoted to prayer, or through a conversation with a brother or sister around a campfire.

With 12,000 guests at Skycroft this year so far, we know God is moving in the lives of the people that have visited! We thank God for preserving and flourishing this special place of ministry for 50 years.

In the early years of Skycroft, the leaders of our two-state Convention coined the slogan, "Mountain for the Master" as they envisioned all that could take place on this beautiful mountaintop property set apart for God's purposes. I love these words penned by James Allcock, part of a song he wrote for the dedication of Skycroft:

Our Mountain for the Master,
Dear Father let it be,
In study or in leisure,
A place, O Lord, with Thee.
A place for preparation,

For study of Thy Word, A place of contemplation, To let Thy voice be heard.

Praise God that 50 years later this vision holds true! Through the Lord's goodness and faithfulness, and the service of many faithful saints, Skycroft continues to be a place where the thousands gather to hear His voice. We pray for another 50 years of ministry on the mountain. Dear Father let it be!

Church Planting Report

To my fellow Southern Baptists throughout Maryland and Delaware,

It is a joy and an honor to write the 2022 Baptist Convention of Maryland/ Delaware Church Planting report for you, my brothers and sisters. I want to begin by sharing a word of gratitude. Thank you for praying for, supporting, and sending church planters. Thank you for giving to the Cooperative Program (CP) and the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering (AAEO). As many of you know, 50% of AAEO goes directly to church planting. In 2022, for the second year in a row, Southern Baptists have broken the giving record for this offering by donating a total of \$68.9 million. In fact, giving to this offering has exceeded records in five of the last six years.

There are many things that we can celebrate as a convention. I'll begin with the numbers. We currently have thirty-two church planters in the field. In the last ten years, the partnership between the BCM/D, the North American Mission Board, and the Send Network has resulted in 93 healthy autonomous churches. We also have three newly assessed and endorsed church planters that are in the early stages of deployment. As we end this year, we are already registering candidates for our next assessment in the Spring of 2023. Each of these churches is full of stories about men and women, boys and girls, whose lives have been changed by the gospel! God is so good!

We can also celebrate the bright future of the Send Network. There have been many changes in our Network recently, but our mission remains the same: We want to see churches planting churches everywhere for everyone. One of the more momentous changes has been the hiring of Vance Pittman to lead our family of churches. He has built an incredible team (that still includes our very own BCM/D Executive Director Michael Crawford). I truly believe that the Send Network is positioned to effectively and faithfully continue our work with local churches as they engage their cities and states, make disciples, and plant new churches.

We have communicated. We have celebrated. Now, I would like to close out this report with a call to collaboration. Brothers and sisters, we need your help. The work of church planting is not something that conventions can do, nor is it something that networks can do. We know from the New Testament that the biblical model of multiplication relies on churches planting churches. So, here is what I am asking you to do. First, let's pray. Let's recognize that the harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few, and let us cry out to God, asking him to send laborers into His harvest. Then, let's plan. Let's act as if God is going to answer our prayers. Let's begin training and teaching as if God is going to call his children into ministry. The Send Network will join you in prayer and we'll gladly help you with your plans. Let's work together to engage our cities, make disciples, and plant churches!

Church Services Report

The BCM/D Church Services team continues to serve the churches of our multi-state convention. Unique challenges remain in doing so during these days of Covid, yet the BCM/D Church Services staff remains available to assist churches in whatever manner that best suits their needs. This has included conducting in-person events, virtual events via zoom, meeting with leadership groups, and hosting corporate gatherings. We have also served in a myriad of other ways as we have continued to resource the needs of local churches.

One of our biggest efforts this year has been our Pathways initiative, an effort to train churches to prevent sexual abuse and protect the vulnerable people among them. There was much discussion about this at the SBC annual meeting in Anaheim this year, including the adoption of two primary recommendations: the formation of an Abuse Reform Implementation Task Force appointed by the SBC President and the development of a "Ministry Check" website to share "properly vetted information."

The BCM/D was active prior to our Pathways efforts, however, having formed our own Task Force, chaired by BCM/D Associate Executive Director, Tom Stolle. Others serving on this task force include BCM/D Youth and Children's Ministry Consultant Kris Buckman; Pastor Brad O'Brien; Pastor and Director of Missions Keith Myer; and BCM/D Church Member and traumainformed psychiatrist Dr. Bergina Isbell. This task force is overseeing the efforts to lead our churches to provide protective measures and develop resources for churches to be more effective in such efforts. In addition, they have worked in conjunction with the Church Services department to host and conduct multiple Pathways events.

Greensboro Baptist Church hosted our inaugural Pathways event on Feb. 26. Our second event was hosted by Cresthill Church in Bowie, MD, on April 30. The third corporate event for 2022 was held at Mountain City Church in Frostburg, MD, on June 4. In total, approximately 115 people attended this vital training during these three events.

In addition, multiple churches and one association conducted condensed Pathways events led by BCM/D staff. The Church Services staff remains available to assist any church that desires to implement improved safety measures for their church.

In addition, Myer presented a motion at the annual SBC meeting in Anaheim for a day to be created on the SBC calendar to raise awareness of "abuse of any kind." This motion was referred to the Executive Committee, who, in their September meeting, decided to add such a Sunday to the SBC calendar. The first "Caring Well Sunday" will be September 24, 2023.

Another large initiative for the Church Services team was our effort to contact each BCM/D member church so that we could learn more about their ministries, understand their uniquenesses more, and discover ways we can more effectively partner together. Each call was typically a wonderful opportunity to develop relational equity and remind the churches that the

BCM/D exists for them, not vice versa. We are grateful for the willing participation of the many churches that took part.

Other major Church Services events since last year's annual meeting have included:

Breakfast with the SBC President:

On Dec. 4, approximately 55 people gathered at Skycroft to hear from Dr. Ed Litton, SBC President. In addition, his wife, Kathy Litton, spoke to the women who gathered. We were grateful for the opportunity to hear from our Convention President and thankful for the partnership with Covenant Church in Shepherdstown, West Virginia, which made this opportunity possible.

Pastors' Appreciation Event:

On Jan. 11-12, 20 pastors and their wives, along with several BCM/D staff, gathered in Bethany Beach for a time of fellowship, devotion, and recreation. We always want to let our pastors know their efforts are appreciated, and this was one small way we could do that for some of them.

Pastor's Tax Seminar:

On Jan. 25, our annual tax seminar was held, with approximately 75 people participating either in person or online. This annual event has come to be much appreciated by many as Tom Stolle ably leads participants to better understand the nuances of ministerial taxes.

Pastor's Reset Retreat:

March 15-16 saw approximately 30 people gather on the mountain at Skycroft as Dr. Richard Blackaby and Dr. Rick Fisher from Blackaby Ministries led pastors to consider "Leading Through Crisis Times."

Roundtable Events:

Dr. Chuck Lawless, from Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary, was with us May 19-21 to lead us to better understand Spiritual Warfare. Three events were held for this. New City Church in Dover, DE, hosted on Thursday evening, May 19. First Baptist, in Waldorf, MD, hosted on Friday morning, May 20. And Paramount Baptist in Hagerstown, MD, hosted on Saturday morning, May 21. Between the three events, approximately 50 people attended this training.

The Church Services department continued its overall focus on revitalization efforts among our churches. At the 2021 Annual Meeting, BCM/D adopted a goal of 100 member churches engaged in church revitalization by the year 2025. The Church Services team has continued to focus on these efforts during this last year by hosting, at present, two ongoing, revitalization-centered cohorts involving pastors/staff from 15 different BCM/D churches. Participants have been exploring revitalization competencies and skills, taking ministry actions in their own churches and praying with and for one another.

Also, the BCM/D hosted a Revitalizing Worship webinar with Dr. Joseph Crider from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary which involved 28 people. As an outgrowth of this webinar, a worship pastors group was launched and is being facilitated by Jason Brown from First Baptist, Upper Marlboro, MD. This group is helping the worship leaders of our churches to connect and encourage one another, as well as help resource each other.

A half-dozen BCM/D pastors are pursuing revitalization using a purpose-driven model of ministry. Our team continues to point those who express this interest to our partners at the DREAM church conference, hosted by Oak Ridge Baptist Church in Salisbury, MD. Pastors who engaged our team of church consultants this last year have dealt with revitalization topics dealing with everything from the spiritual renewal of God's people to relaunching group ministries, to improving ministries to children/youth, to engaging their communities with the gospel of Jesus Christ.

We also continued to work with our churches facing pastoral transitions, assisting several at various levels through their transition. Over the past year and a half, eighteen BCM/D churches have had pastors that either retired or resigned. Some of these churches have already secured new leadership, but most remain at various stages of their process. Church Services staff have met with the leadership groups of many of these churches to provide training and guidance in their transition process. In addition, we maintain a database of resumés of potential interim pastors and full-time pastors. This past year, we also implemented a policy of mandatory background checks on anyone whose resumé is involved in our distribution process. Every potential candidate is asked to submit to a background check, and no resumé will be shared with a church unless it has first been cleared through a background check.

As in the past, we once again saw wonderful efforts with disability ministry through both the "Every Child Matters" conference and camp in the summer at Skycroft. These efforts are made possible through a wonderful partnership with The Banquet Network.

Similarly, Church Services engaged in efforts to encourage our churches in their work with Vacation Bible School. The network of both youth and children's leaders has continued to grow and find wonderful connections through social media efforts and small lunchtime gatherings. This not only strengthens relationships but also enables churches to partner together by sharing resources.

This past year the Church Services department also sought to expand educational opportunities for members of our BCM/D churches. We launched a partnership with Lancaster Bible College | Capital Seminary, which provides tuition discounts for bachelor's and master's level students. In addition, we are also working to develop a partnership with Metro Baltimore Seminary. Both will make education more accessible for those who participate. These partnerships also have the capability to provide churches with potential interns, staff members, and pastors who are either in the process of preparing for ministry or have recently finished their academic preparation.

Women's Ministry, Collegiate Ministry, WMU Camp, Boys and Girls Camps, Youth Camps, Disaster Relief work, and Church and Community Ministry also continued to provide opportunities for BCM/D churches to network and partner together in larger collective efforts. These efforts enabled churches to better serve their communities, foster discipleship, and enhance fellowship among fellow Kingdom citizens. So, whether we are serving an individual church or participating with multiple churches through corporate events, the goal and desire of BCM/D's Church Services Team is that we might strengthen churches to be more effective in their ministry of building disciples and building gospel-centered, Kingdom-minded bodies of believers. May such be true for the glory of God!

Baptist Foundation of Maryland/Delaware, Inc

The Baptist Foundation of Maryland/Delaware works to advance the message of the gospel through the prudent management of invested funds that benefit Baptist work in Maryland/Delaware and around the world. We also provide loans to BCM/D-affiliated churches and associations.

The Foundation currently manages assets of approximately \$11.9 million dollars (\$8.8 million in invested funds and \$3.1 million in church loan funds). Significant growth in the amount of managed assets has occurred from \$3.8 million in 1991.

For the fiscal year ended September 30, 2022, the Foundation distributed \$640,497.99 to Southern Baptist and Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware ministry and mission causes.

Through the Foundation's Church Loan programs, 18 churches affiliated with the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware are being assisted with approximately \$2.6 million dollars in outstanding loans. The advantages of these church loans are favorable.

interest rates and low closing costs. In addition to the above-referenced distribution, the Foundation makes a distribution annually to the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware to be used to start churches and to strengthen existing churches. The distribution to be made for the fiscal year ended September 30, 2022, totals \$116,950.37.

The Baptist Foundation is positioned to manage endowment funds for churches while saving them money on administration. Even churches with modest investment needs may take advantage of discounts typically offered only to much larger dollar investors simply by using the services of the Baptist Foundation. We encourage churches to partner with us to create Heritage Funds to ensure funding for their future ministry efforts. An additional investment option exists via our partnership with the Kentucky Baptist Foundation, offering BCM/D affiliated churches a low-risk investment alternative to traditional money market and savings accounts.

The Baptist Foundation continues to educate our churches in estate planning.
