# ***Constitution of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, Inc.***

*(Approved at the 2023 BCM/D Annual Meeting)*

## **Article I • Name**

The body will be called the Baptist Convention of Maryland/ Delaware, Inc.

## **Article II • Mission Statement**

**Section 1**—The Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware will intentionally assist in the starting and strengthening of congregations so that together we can fulfill Jesus' commands in Matthew 28:19-20 and Acts 1:8.

**Section 2**—This Convention is an autonomous body and is neither limited nor restrained by any authority or decision of any other Baptist body and will achieve its objectives through such means as this Convention alone determines.

**Section 3**—This Convention does not have any ecclesiastical authority to limit the autonomy of the local congregation.

**Section 4**—This Convention recognizes the Southern Baptist Convention as our primary instrument to further the cause of Christ on a worldwide basis. This Convention pledges its loyalty and support to the purposes served by the Southern Baptist Convention.

## **Article III • Membership**

**Section 1**—The membership of this Convention will consist of messengers who are members of Baptist churches which are in friendly cooperation with this Convention and sympathetic with its mission and work, affirm the Baptist Faith & Message 2000, and which have during the preceding 12 months (October 1 through September 30) been bona fide contributors to the work of this Convention. In order to be affiliated with the BCM/D, a local church must seek to protect vulnerable adults and children from sexual abuse in concrete ways which reflect the spirit and theology of Scripture.

Disaffiliation of Membership will occur in the following: when Baptist churches are no longer either in friendly cooperation with this convention and sympathetic with its mission and work, no longer affirm the Baptist Faith & Message 2000, or which have not during the preceding 12 months (October 1 through September 30) been bona fide contributors to the work of this Convention, or Disaffiliation of a church will occur when a church is found to be in open and unrepentant beliefs or behaviors that are contrary to the BF&M 2000.

**Section 2**—Each cooperating member church meeting the requirements in Article III Section 1 will be entitled to two (2) messengers; each cooperating church exceeding fifty (50) members will then be given one additional messenger for each additional fifty (50) members or part thereof; or one additional messenger for each \$750 contributed to the work of this Convention through the Cooperative Program until the maximum of thirty (30) is reached.

**Section 3**—Messengers to this Convention will be certified by their churches. This Convention will be the final judge of election and qualifications of its members.

**Section 4**—The officers of this Convention, the employed staff of this Convention, and its agencies may be messengers provided they are elected by the church in which they hold membership.

#### **Article IV • Meetings**

**Section 1**—This Convention will meet at least once each year, hereafter known as the Annual Meeting, at such time and place as may be fixed by this Convention at the Annual Meeting held the preceding year. The duly appointed messengers of the cooperating churches will comprise the voting body of this Convention.

**Section 2**—In case of an emergency, the General Mission Board is empowered to change the time and place of meeting or call a special meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members present and voting.

**Section 3**—Notice of any special meeting will be given at least thirty (30) days prior thereto by publication online or in such other ways as the General Mission Board may direct.

#### **Article V • Officers**

**Section 1**—The Officers of this Convention will be a President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, Corporate Secretary, Treasurer, Recording Secretary, and an Assistant Recording Secretary. All but the Corporate Secretary and Treasurer will be elected at each Annual Meeting by a majority of the duly elected messengers present and voting, and will hold office until their successors are elected and installed. Employees of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware are ineligible to serve as officers of this Convention with the exception of the Executive Director who will serve as Corporate Secretary and the Director of Finance who will serve as Treasurer.

**Section 2**—Nominations will be from the floor. Election will be by ballot except where there is a single nominee for an office. In the latter case, the President will instruct the Secretary to cast a unanimous ballot for the nominee.

**Section 3**—Officers will serve for one (1) year and hold office until their successors are elected and qualified; however, the President and Vice Presidents may not serve more than two (2) complete successive terms in office. Terms of office will commence at final adjournment of the Annual Meeting in session at the time of their election and terminate in the final adjournment of the succeeding regular session of the Annual Meeting. In case of death, disability of, or other cause making necessary the retirement of the President, the Vice Presidents will succeed in order. The General Mission Board will determine when an office is vacant due to the disability of an incumbent.

**Section 4**—The President will preside over the deliberations of the Annual Meeting and will perform other duties as may be customary to the position or as determined in the Bylaws, and will become an ex officio member of all Convention committees and boards. The President will continue as ex officio member of the General Mission Board for one full year immediately following tenure as President of this Convention unless elected to fill a vacancy in the regular membership of the Board.

**Section 5**—The Vice President may, in the absence of the President or when requested by the President, preside over the Annual Meeting and will perform other duties as may be provided in the Bylaws or as requested by the President.

**Section 6**—The Secretary will keep accurate minutes of all sessions of this Convention and will cause these to be published in suitable form in the Annual of this Convention together with other information as this Convention or the General Mission Board of this Convention deems necessary and proper.

**Section 7**—The President will be authorized to sign legal papers for the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, Inc. If unable to do so, the First Vice President or the Second Vice President will be so authorized.

**Section 8**—Should the President and Vice Presidents be unable to serve, the duties of the President will devolve upon the President of the General Mission Board until said Board will elect an interim President.

## **Article VI • General Mission Board**

**Section 1**—This Convention will elect a General Mission Board to be known as the General Mission Board, none of whose members will be employees of said Board. Fifty-one percent will be a quorum for business.

The Rules of Order for the meetings of the General Mission Board will be those in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order.

The General Mission Board will be composed of three members from the geographic area of each association. For each 5000 resident members or major fraction thereof, one additional Board member will be chosen, up to but not to exceed a total of ten Board members from any association. The President of this Convention, the President of the Woman's Missionary Union and the Maryland/Delaware member of the Southern Baptist Convention Executive Committee will serve as at-large members of the Board. Board members selected by virtue of their Convention offices, will not be used in determining the number of members from an association or local church.

The term of the office of the members will be four years with, as nearly as possible, the terms of one-fourth of the members expiring each year. Any member serving for a full term or three years of an unexpired term will not be eligible for reelection until one year has expired.

Membership on the Board will cease when the member dies, moves membership from a church within the Convention, or the member's church ceases to be in cooperating fellowship with this Convention. In the event a member moves from a church in one association to another within this Convention, or the member's church changes from one association to another within this Convention, the member will be eligible to serve until a successor is elected at the next Annual Meeting. Membership on the Board will automatically be terminated when a member is absent for two consecutive meetings of the Board without notification submitted to the Board President or the Executive Director. The member will be notified of such termination.

**Section 2**—The members of the General Mission Board will be elected by this Convention, after receiving nominations from the committee selected by this Convention for this purpose, and after giving opportunity for nominations from the floor of this Convention.

**Section 3**—The work of this Convention, except as otherwise specified, will be committed to the General Mission Board described as follows: The General Mission Board of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware will act for this Convention ad interim promoting all the interests of the Kingdom, such as evangelism, missions, education, benevolence, social welfare, and public morals, and so on. The General Mission Board will not have authority to control the agencies and institutions of this Convention, but it will maintain general care and responsibility for the work of same. It is instructed to study annually their reports, to interpret and apply the rules of the constitution and the business and financial policy of this Convention as items may apply to any of the agencies of this Convention, to make recommendations directly to agencies and also to make whatever recommendations to this Convention concerning them it may deem advisable.

**Section 4**—This Convention will annually elect members to fill all vacancies on the Board.

## **Article VII • Agencies**

**Section 1**—The Convention may establish agencies for the purpose of performing collateral Christian services. An agency will be a separate corporation independent of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware in its day-to-day operations but will work in cooperation with the Convention in order to avoid costly duplication. The Convention and each agency will establish, through the General Mission Board, an agreement defining their working relationship. An agency of this Convention will act in accordance with our historic Baptist doctrine and practices.

**Section 2**—The trustees of these agencies will be elected by this Convention after receiving nominations from the Committee selected by this Convention for this purpose and after giving opportunity for nominations from the floor of this Convention. The number of trustees for each agency and their terms of office will be in accordance with the requirements of their respective charters and bylaws.

**Section 3**—All agencies sharing in the Cooperative Program receipts must include a summary of their financial report in the annual report to the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, and the General Mission Board will request a copy of the budget of all agencies sharing in the Cooperative Program receipts along with their requests for financial assistance.

**Section 4**—No agency of this Convention will create any liability or indebtedness (except such as can and will be repaid out of its anticipated receipts for current operations within a period of three years) without the consent of this Convention or the General Mission Board. In order to obtain such approval, the agency must file a statement showing the source of such anticipated receipts. Such consent must be likewise obtained for a purchase of properties or construction of same, subject to liens or encumbrances which cannot be repaid out of its anticipated receipts for current operations within a period of three years.

**Section 5**—Proposals for the establishment of new agencies must follow one of the following procedures: (1) Authority may be granted upon favorable vote by two successive Annual Meetings, or (2) Authority may be granted by vote of one Annual Meeting provided a favorable recommendation is made by the General Mission Board, after thorough study, and provided further that the proposal is published online 45 days before the Annual Meeting or in such other ways as the General Mission Board may direct.

**Section 6**—The agency of this Convention is the Baptist Foundation of Maryland/Delaware, Inc.

## **Article VIII • Business and Financial Policy**

**Section 1**—This Convention approves the Cooperative Program of Southern Baptists as its plan of world mission work and appeals to the churches to support it and to recognize the wisdom and right of this Convention to divide equitably the Cooperative Program receipts.

**Section 2**—Cooperative Program gifts will be distributed on a percentage basis approved by this Convention and designated gifts according to the wishes of the donors. The Administrative Committee of the General Mission Board will recommend at each pre-convention meeting of the General Mission Board the Cooperative Program goal and the distribution of receipts for the following year. Financial reports will be given at each meeting of the Board and an annual review conducted.

**Section 3**—The fiscal year of the General Mission Board and this Convention will be the calendar year.

**Section 4**—All funds entrusted to this Convention or to any of its boards or agencies will be strictly applied according to the expressed will and direction of the donors.

**Section 5**—This Convention will receive contributions, legacies and bequests for the several objects which it fosters. The Baptist Foundation of Maryland/Delaware, Inc., is the agency designated for the management of trust funds.

## **Article IX • The Denominational Paper**

**Section 1**—The BaptistLIFE will be the official news journal of this Convention.

**Section 2**—The General Mission Board of this Convention will be responsible for the conduct of this phase of our work through the Executive Director.

## **Article X • Woman's Missionary Union**

The Woman's Missionary Union of Maryland/Delaware is recognized as an auxiliary of this Convention whose accomplishments and potentialities in good works are appreciated as being of immeasurable value to the Christian cause.

## **Article XI • Miscellaneous**

**Section 1**—Neither this Convention nor any agency owned or supported in whole or in part by this Convention, will accept or receive, directly or indirectly, any gift, grant, or aid from the Federal or State governments or any governmental agency except for definite and full services rendered by the agency with the approval of this Convention or its General Mission Board. In any debatable instance that may occur, the General Mission Board will interpret this statement subject to the approval of this Convention.

**Section 2**—Any special campaign for funds must be specifically approved by vote of this Convention or the General Mission Board.

## **Article XII • Amendment**



All amendments to this constitution must be submitted in writing at an Annual Meeting. A vote will be taken when the amendment is presented and at the succeeding annual session. The proposed amendment may be modified in form but not in substance upon presentation for vote at the second session. The amendment will be adopted only after an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the messengers present and voting at two successive Annual Meetings. Non-substantive changes such as grammatical corrections and title or name changes may be made by the Administrative Committee of the General Mission Board and included in their report at the Annual Meeting of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware.

## ***Bylaws of the Baptist Convention of***

### ***Maryland/Delaware, Inc.***

(Revised at the 2021 BCM/D Annual Meeting)

The work of this Convention will be governed by the following bylaws:

#### **Article I • Duties of Officers**

**Section 1**—The President will preside over the deliberations of the Annual Meeting and discharge such other duties as are imposed by this Convention or as are incumbent on the presiding officer of a deliberating body. At least two months prior to the Annual Meeting, the President, in consultation with the two Vice Presidents, will appoint a Committee on Credentials and Enrollment, a Committee on Committees, a Resolutions Committee, and other committees when so directed by the Body (see Article II, Section 1). In case of death or incapacity to serve, the Vice Presidents will succeed the President in order.

**Section 2**—A First Vice President and a Second Vice President will discharge such duties as requested by the President, will serve as ex officio members of the General Mission Board, and in the event of the death or disability of the President, will succeed the President in order of their rank.

**Section 3**—The Recording Secretary will record and preserve the proceedings of this Convention and will, in cooperation with the Executive Director, have the same published. The Assistant Recording Secretary will serve in the absence of the Recording Secretary and assist as necessary.

**Section 4**—The Corporate Secretary will perform the duties legally required of this office.

**Section 5**—The President and the Executive Director will be advisory to all Convention committees and agencies.

#### **Article II • Committees and Their Duties**

##### **Administrative Guidelines for All Committees**

All committees will reflect, as much as possible, a balance between vocational ministers and others. An ex-officio member will have voting privileges. No person will be elected to serve simultaneously on more than one standing committee.

No church will have more than two representatives simultaneously elected to serve on BCM/D committees, the General Mission Board, or as trustees of a BCM/D institution or agency.

Committees of this Convention may appoint persons other than members to special limited purpose subcommittees and advisory committees provided such persons will serve only in an advisory capacity and will not be permitted to vote at meetings of the authorizing committee.

Membership on committees will cease when the member dies, moves membership from a church within the Convention, or the member's church ceases to be in cooperating fellowship with this Convention. In the event a member moves from a church in one association to another within this Convention, or the member's church changes from one association to another within this Convention, the member will be eligible to serve until a successor is elected at the next Annual Meeting. Membership on the Board will automatically be terminated when a member is absent for two consecutive meetings of the Board without notification submitted to the Board President or the Executive Director. The member will be notified of such termination.

In the event of a vacancy between Annual Meetings, the President shall appoint members to fill that vacancy as an interim until approval at the next Annual Meeting. This would apply to all BCM/D committees.

**Section 1**—In advance of the Annual Meeting, the President will appoint the following committees:

**1. Committee on Credentials and Enrollment**—The committee will consist of five members whose duties it will be to register messengers and visitors. This committee will review and rule upon any questions which may arise in registration concerning the credentials of messengers. Any such ruling may be appealed to this Convention during business session. This Committee will make a report to the assembled messengers upon the call of the President, and will pass on the credentials of all messengers.

The Committee on Credentials and Enrollment will function under the following guidelines:

- Each person elected by a church, cooperating with the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, as a messenger to the Annual Meeting will be registered as a messenger to this Convention upon presentation of proper credentials. Credentials will be presented by each messenger, in person, at the Convention registration desk and will be in the following form:
- A completed and signed BCM/D registration card certifying the messenger's election in accordance with Article III Membership of the Constitution of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, Inc.; but if the messenger does not have the messenger registration card,
- A letter from the messenger's church, signed by the clerk or moderator of the church certifying messenger's election in accordance with Article III Membership of the Constitution of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, Inc.; or

**2. Committee on Committees**—This committee will consist of one member from each association whose duty it will be to nominate for election by this Convention the members and chairpersons of the committees listed in Sections 2 and 3 of this article, with the exception of the Committee on Committees, and other committees as may be assigned to it. Members of this committee will be appointed to a three-year term, one-third of its number retiring each year. A member of this committee cannot be nominated as a member of the General Mission Board, a trustee of the agencies of this Convention, or a member of any Convention committee.

**3. Resolutions Committee**—This committee will consist of five members. It will be responsible for initiating, reviewing, researching, preparing and recommending all resolutions for adoption. Only

resolutions presented to the Resolutions Committee at least 45 days in advance of the Annual Meeting will be considered by the committee before the first session. Other resolutions may be referred to the committee by the general body during the session as described in Article VI, Section 2. Resolutions should seek to build up and unify the body rather than divide it; therefore, only resolutions that have the full consensus of the committee will be presented at the Annual Meeting.

An announcement will be published online, or in such other ways as the General Mission Board may direct, no later than 75 days before the Annual Meeting requesting resolutions for the committee's consideration and possible presentation at the Annual Meeting. Proposed resolutions will be submitted in writing and addressed to either committee members or to: Resolutions Committee, BCM/D, 10255 Old Columbia Road, Columbia, Maryland 21046-1716.

**Section 2**—This Convention will elect the following committees to report to the next Annual Meeting:

**1. Committee on Order of Business**—This committee will consist of one member from each association. The members of this committee will be elected to a three-year term, one-third of their number retiring each year. The committee will be responsible for recommending to this Convention the place, time, preacher, and music director of the Annual Meeting one year hence and, if feasible, the time and place two years hence. The committee will present to the opening session of the Annual Meeting for adoption, a recommended agenda for the Annual Meeting.

**2. Committee to Nominate the Members of the General Mission Board and Trustees of the Agencies of this Convention**—This committee will consist of one member from each association. Members of this committee will be elected to a three-year term, one-third of their number retiring each year. The head of an agency, or his representative, will meet with the committee to suggest names for consideration on the committee, for vacancies on the respective agency's board of trustees and for the agency's representatives on the General Mission Board. A member of this committee cannot be nominated as a member of the General Mission Board, a trustee of the agencies of this Convention, or a member of any Convention committee.

**3. The Christian Life and Public Affairs Committee**—This committee will act for this Convention in the field of Christian ethics, public affairs, interfaith cooperation, and Christian social concerns. Specifically, but not exclusively, these areas will include family life, human relations, race relations, moral issues, economic life, daily work, citizenship, church-state relations, cooperative relationships with other religious groups, and those areas where the gospel and the churches affect or are affected by community and public life. The Christian Life and Public Affairs Committee may act on matters referred to it by this Convention, by the General Mission Board, or by any agency of this Convention

The Christian Life and Public Affairs Committee will be responsible for initiating consideration and study, and for recommending action of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware and/or General Mission Board on any matter or issue falling within the scope and purpose as set forth in the preceding paragraph.

The committee will be elected and directly responsible to the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware. It will report annually to this Convention.

The committee is authorized to make pronouncements on matters within its scope and purpose in as far as they are consistent with actions previously taken by the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware,

the General Mission Board, or the Southern Baptist Convention. However, under no circumstances will the committee assume the exercise of authority for this Convention, its agencies or the churches.

The Christian Life and Public Affairs Committee will be composed of one member from each association. At least half the members will be lay people. All members will be elected by the Convention in the Annual Meeting. Members will be elected to a three-year term, one-third of their number retiring each year. No member can be elected to serve more than two full terms of office until at least one year will have elapsed after the second full term. A member may be elected to complete an unexpired term caused by vacancy and thereafter be elected to two full terms per above. In addition, the Executive Director will annually designate a Convention staff member as a consultant to this committee. Staff member succession will be at the discretion of the Executive Director.

The committee will elect a recording secretary and such other officers each year as it will deem necessary. The committee will meet quarterly and/or at such other times as will be designated by the chairperson.

The financial needs of the Christian Life and Public Affairs Committee will be through the budget of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware.

### **Article III • Avoidance of Illegal Action**

No action of this Convention will be construed as authorizing its committees or related agencies to take any action that may be contrary to the law.

### **Article IV • General Mission Board**

#### **Section 1 —Meetings**

The General Mission Board will have three regular meetings annually. Additional meetings may be called by the Administrative Committee.

#### **Section 2—Officers**

At the first meeting of the General Mission Board, annually after its election, there will be elected from the membership of the Board the following officers who will serve one year or until their successors are elected and qualified: President, Vice President, Recording Secretary, Assistant Recording Secretary.

#### **Section 3—Work**

The General Mission Board will serve as the corporate body and will have the power to act for this Convention in the interim between Annual Meetings except as specifically limited by the Constitution, or tasks committed to Boards of Trustees of its agencies. It will, therefore, be the purpose of the General Mission Board to promote and supervise such programs and activities as may be approved by the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware from time to time. It will have no power to contravene any action of this Convention nor to launch any new agencies. It may provide for the expansion of any phase of its work which its income and resources may make possible. The incumbent General Mission Board, its officers and committees will continue to function until the new General Mission Board, at its first meeting after the Annual Meeting of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/ Delaware, is duly organized. For the purpose of carrying out the mission of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, the Board

will elect an Executive Director and other staff in keeping with the needs, resources, and guidelines. All Convention employees will serve for an indefinite period of time.

The General Mission Board will recommend to this Convention the division of Cooperative Program gifts between the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware and Southern Baptist Convention and the division of funds among the objects of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware.

#### Section 4—Reports

The General Mission Board will make a full-year report to this Convention of its activities during the year. The Board will have its report printed and ready for distribution at the first session of the Annual Meeting, including reports from all other agencies of this Convention.

#### Section 5—Financial Review

The General Mission Board will employ a certified public accountant each year to review the books and accounts of the Treasurer. Annual reviews will be reported to the Board and printed in the minutes of this Convention.

#### Section 6—Committees

**1. Nominating Committee**—This committee will be composed of the Vice President of the General Mission Board, who will serve as chairperson, and four members appointed by the General Mission Board President. Should the Vice President not be able to serve on the Nominating Committee, the General Mission Board President will appoint another committee member and designate the chairperson. This committee will present nominations for General Mission Board officers and the chairperson and members of the Administrative Committee at its organizational meeting. Members of this committee cannot be nominated as members of the Administrative Committee.

**2. Administrative Committee Purpose**—The Administrative Committee performs normal administrative committee responsibilities for the General Mission Board between regular meetings and works with the Executive Director in the implementation of the Board's policies, programs, and services assigned to its general care.

- **Membership**—The Administrative Committee will be comprised of a chairperson, the President of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, the President of the General Mission Board, the past BCM/D President (one year), and one member from the geographic region of each association. The Executive Director and Associate Executive Director will serve as ex-officio members.
- **Responsibilities**—The committee, in cooperation with the Executive Director and Associate Executive Director, will provide for the administering of the business and administrative affairs of the General Mission Board and for the monitoring of its Business and Financial Plan, including Stewardship Development and Cooperative Program Development. It will monitor the effectiveness of the services and programs of the General Mission Board, maintain employee policies and guidelines, serve as personnel committee, budget committee, perform committee functions for the General Mission Board and assist the Executive Director in accomplishing the purposes of the Board. The committee is responsible for an annual review of the Constitution and Bylaws of this Convention.

- Meetings—The Administrative Committee will meet at times specified by the General Mission Board and, if extra meetings are necessary, at times specified by the Executive Director and the chairperson of the Administrative Committee. An agenda will be jointly approved by the Executive Director and the chairperson and distributed at the meeting.

### 3. Ad Hoc Committees

Ad Hoc Committees will be appointed as needed by the president of the General Mission Board in consultation with the Administrative Committee chairperson and the Executive Director. Appointments will be reported to the General Mission Board at the next meeting.

### 4. Strategic Planning Teams

Strategic Planning Teams will report at each regular General Mission Board meeting. Strategies relating to budget and personnel matters must be approved by the General Mission Board.

## **Article V • Eligibility for Membership on Boards**

Each member of the General Mission Board and trustees of any agency of this Convention will be a member, for at least twelve months preceding election, of one church which cooperates with this Convention.

The incumbent General Mission Board, its officers and committees, will continue to function until the new General Mission Board, at its first meeting during or after the Annual Meeting of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, is duly organized. The same is true for trustees and directors of any agency of this Convention.

## **Article VI • Procedure for the Annual Meeting**

### Section 1—Rules

1. The rules of order for the sessions of the Annual Meeting will be those in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order, but in cases where the meaning may not be clear, the President's discretion will be exercised. The President may appoint a Parliamentarian who will advise and assist the President with respect to all matters involving parliamentary procedure.
2. No person addressing the Annual Meeting may speak more than twice on the same subject without unanimous consent.
3. The President is charged at all times with the maintenance of decorum and order.
4. The President will only allow new business to be considered once during the Annual Meeting by permission of majority vote of the messengers present.

### Section 2—Resolutions

All resolutions considered at the Annual Meeting will come from the Resolutions Committee and have their full consensus or, as a redress, one presented to but rejected by the committee may be ordered to the floor under a "question of privilege" without having the full consensus of the committee. All

resolutions available to the Resolutions Committee 45 days before the Annual Meeting will be automatically considered by the committee and, if accepted, will be printed and distributed at the first session of the Annual Meeting. If, in the opinion of the President, a messenger has a “copy-ready master” of a resolution with justifiable reason for not meeting the 45-day rule, it may be referred to the Resolutions Committee by the assembly at the first session. The action should follow the form: (Petitioner) “Mr. President, I request the consideration of a resolution concerning (subject).”; whereupon the President immediately puts the question without debate, “(Messenger) requests the privilege of having a late resolution considered, all who favor instructing the Resolutions Committee to review this resolution for consideration ... (vote).”

All resolutions passed at the Annual Meeting are the opinion of the overwhelming majority of the messengers present at that Annual Meeting but are not binding on the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, local associations, local congregations or individual Baptists. In order for a resolution to express the clear opinion of the messengers at the Annual Meeting, successful adoption will require an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the messengers present and voting.

### Section 3—Election of Officers

1. The Officers of this Convention will be nominated from the floor, and the election will be by secret ballot when two or more persons are nominated for the same office.
  - The one receiving the majority of all votes will be declared elected.
  - The chairperson of the Credentials Committee hands the results of the vote to the presiding officer who announces first whether the vote is a majority vote or not. If a majority, the candidate is declared elected. If not a majority, the chairperson declares a run-off of the two receiving the highest number of votes.
  - The vote is not effective until announced.
2. The President will be elected before the Vice Presidents are nominated and the First Vice President is to be elected before receiving nominations for the Second Vice President.

### Article VII • Amendments to Bylaws

The Bylaws may be altered by a majority vote of the messengers present at the Annual Meeting of this Convention. Non-substantive changes such as grammatical corrections and title or name changes may be made by the Administrative Committee of the General Mission Board and included in their report at the Annual Meeting of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware.

**Section 2**—Each member church meeting the requirements in Article III Section 1 will be entitled to two (2) messengers; each cooperating church exceeding fifty (50) members will then be given one additional messenger for each additional fifty (50) members or part thereof; or one additional messenger for each \$750 contributed to the work of this Convention through the Cooperative Program until the maximum of thirty (30) is reached.

**Meeting Minutes**

The meeting began with a time of worship led by Cresthill Baptist Church.

**Introduction**

President Fred Caudle opened the meeting by sharing the background leading to the proposed sale of the BCM/D building. He stated that he supports the decision, understanding that selling the property would allow for greater ministry impact. He emphasized that his commitment lies not with a building but with the ministry of Jesus Christ and wherever He is at work. Caudle noted that the motion to sell does not require a second and will be approved by simple majority vote before introducing Executive Director Tom Stolle.

**Executive Director Report**

Stolle presented details of the proposed sale and shared the broader vision behind the decision. He explained that, though initially concerned about selling in a market with many vacant buildings, the Lord provided a near-asking-price offer without additional repair requests. The sale contract includes a two-step approval process – first by the General Mission Board and then by the messengers – as an intentional act of transparency. The General Mission Board approved the sale on August 24, 2024.

Stolle noted that only one full-time staff member currently works in the building daily, with a few others present on occasion. He reflected on the lessons learned from his own experience working remotely and from the pandemic, which demonstrated that effective ministry can continue without being tied to a building. Citing the Parable of the Talents, he encouraged stewardship that multiplies ministry impact. He stressed that the sale is not driven by financial distress – Cooperative Program giving is up 9.2%, and Skycroft Conference Center continues to experience record demand, now expanding to nine weeks of summer camp. Stolle stated that investing in Skycroft and future ministry leaders is a greater kingdom investment than maintaining a largely vacant building, noting the significant cost savings from the sale.

Stolle announced that South Shore Church is providing meeting and office space for \$18,000 annually – far less than the approximate annual cost of \$100,000 to maintain the facility – and thanked Jamie Caldwell and other pastors willing to partner similarly. He shared that the buyer, the International Church of the Foursquare Gospel, is not Southern Baptist but affirms the core tenets of the gospel. He closed with personal reflections about God's faithfulness and the importance of prayer in ministry.

**Remarks from Jamie Caldwell**

Jamie Caldwell, Lead Pastor of South Shore Church, expressed gratitude that the church's space is being used for BCM/D ministry. Reflecting on his church's journey from meeting in a middle school to merging with South Shore, he affirmed the importance of maximizing resources for kingdom work. Caldwell highlighted that proceeds from the sale would enable BCM/D to expand church planting efforts, allowing both continued partnership with Send Network and independent planting initiatives. He introduced Richard and Payton Pope as new staff members supporting these efforts and voiced strong support for the sale and Stolle's leadership.

**Remarks from Jeremy Dickson**

Jeremy Dickson, Church Partnership Director, recognized the Church Partnership Team and celebrated ministry growth across the region. He shared updates on college ministry, including the launch of a Bible study at Morgan State University for the first time in a decade. He noted record participation in men's and women's conferences and emphasized the growing need for larger venues. Dickson also previewed plans for a major training event at next year's Gathering and underscored the importance of investing in revitalization resources to help local churches directly. He concluded by encouraging messengers to vote in favor of the sale.

**Motion and Discussion**

Caudle moved that the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware sell its Columbia property to the International Church of the Foursquare Gospel for \$2,425,000. During discussion, questions were raised regarding the property's mortgage status, net proceeds, and future operations. Stolle confirmed that there is no mortgage, with net proceeds expected to exceed \$2.2 million. He explained that Skycroft will continue to be used for retreats and events, while South Shore provides a convenient base of operations for staff.

Concerns were expressed about the theological alignment of the purchasing church. Mark Dooley, Associate Executive Director, assured messengers that while the buyer is more charismatic in practice, its doctrinal statement aligns closely with the Baptist Faith and Message, affirming gospel-centered ministry. Other questions addressed staffing additions and the Convention's official mailing address, which will transition to a P.O. Box. Several pastors and attendees voiced their strong support for the sale, citing trust in leadership and a desire to see resources better used for ministry. A motion to end discussion was made and approved.

**Vote**

Caudle called for a vote, and the motion to sell the Columbia building passed unanimously.

**Adjournment**

The meeting concluded with a prayer led by Byron Day.

**Session 1: Sunday Evening, November 10, 2024**

**Worship** – Keasha Wormley and the worship team made up of members of BCM/D churches led in worship.

**Welcome** – Jeremy Dickson and Somer Phoebus welcomed all messengers and guests.

**Call to Order (Enrollment of Messengers)**

Fred Caudle, President of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, called the 188<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware to order. He reported there were 235 registered messengers and 103 guests for a total of 331 attendees.

Caudle announced rules explaining Robert's Rules of Order and presented the Order of Business. The motions were made to adopt the guidelines of the meeting as well as the Order of Business agenda for the 188<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware. The messengers unanimously approved both the guidelines and agenda. Caudle opened the floor for new resolutions. None were presented or passed.

**Worship** – Keasha Wormley and the worship team made up of members of BCM/D churches led in worship.

**Message** – Jamie Caldwell

Jamie Caldwell, pastor of South Shore Church, preached from Genesis 32:22-33. He encouraged all members and attenders to lay aside all things that they are holding onto and hold onto Jesus.

**Corporate Prayer** – Dan Hyun, Director of Formation & Health, led all in a time of corporate prayer.

**Worship** – Keasha Wormley and the worship team made up of members of BCM/D churches led in worship.

**Cooperative Program Report**

Kris Buckman, Youth & Kids Consultant, started her report by reading a letter from a family that has been personally impacted by relief efforts. Giving from the Cooperative Program has contributed to a women's conference attended by 700 women, 4<sup>th</sup> annual Everyone Belongs

Camp for those affected by disabilities, 84 new churches since 2014, the launch of the George Liele Institute, pastors receiving pastoral care, 8 additional campus ministries, hundreds of volunteers equipped on how to respond to sexual abuse and so much more.

### **Baptist Foundation Report**

Baptist Foundation of Maryland/Delaware currently manages assets of approximately \$12.6 million. Through the Church Loan program, 16 churches affiliated with the BCM/D are being assisted, with approximately \$3.1 million dollars in outstanding loans. The Foundation makes a distribution annually to the BCM/D to be used to start churches and strengthen existing churches. The distribution to be made for the fiscal year ended September 30, 2023, totals \$135,656.94.

### **Executive Director Address**

Executive Director Tom Stolle presented his address on Luke 1:26-38. He noted that Mary received unexpected news, yet chose to trust God, believing that nothing is impossible with Him. Her radical yes opens the door to the miraculous, and God honors her faith by preserving her reputation.

### **Sexual Abuse Task Force Update**

Sexual Abuse Task Force Chair Keith Myer reported that the task force has developed resources to help churches recognize, respond to, and prevent abuse, gaining national recognition for its efforts. With strong support from staff and churches, the task force will now expand its work by establishing a care team to provide more comprehensive support. Myer ended by expressing deep gratitude to the BCM/D messengers for embracing this work with both seriousness and joy.

### **Church Evangelism/Missions Report**

Mark Dooley, Associate Executive Director/State Director of Evangelism, encouraged churches to complete their Annual Church Profile (ACP), noting that ACP completion will be required to receive evangelism grants moving forward. In 2023, there were 1,907 baptisms, a 51% increase from the previous year, highlighting the fruit of evangelistic efforts. Eighteen churches and two associations received grants for events promoting evangelism, and 71 pastors have gathered from various associations to further this mission. Churches were also urged to request evangelism kits and attend a March 18th training to learn how to use them, all rooted in the desire that the Gospel be made clear, as expressed in Colossians 4:3-4.

### **Director of Missions**

Dickson and Phoebus closed the evening by expressing appreciation for Directors of Missions, with special recognition given to Kenny Heath for 27 years of service in Western and Dan Sheffield for 60 years in ministry, including 46 years as a DOM. They also honored pastors who are retiring this year, celebrating their faithful service.

## **Session 2: Monday Morning, November 11, 2024**

**Welcome** – Somer Phoebus welcomed messengers and guests and encouraged all to visit exhibits and resource shop. Jeremy Dickson thanked all veterans for their service. Melody Knox highlighted work at Camp Wo-Me-To and then led a time of prayer.

**Worship** – Keasha Wormley and the worship team made up of members of BCM/D churches led in worship.

### **Call to Order (Enrollment of Messengers)**

Fred Caudle called the second session to order and reported there were 280 registered messengers and 111 guests for a total of 391 attendees.

**Message** – Mark Lashey, pastor of LifeHouse Church MOT, preached from Acts 12:1-17, encouraging pastors facing trials by highlighting the power of prayer in desperate circumstances. He reminded listeners that even when situations seem hopeless, hopeful, fervent prayer can bring miraculous deliverance. Lashey reminded all that Jesus remains with us always. He closed with a charge that when shepherds fail to seek the Lord, the flock suffers (Jeremiah 10:21), calling leaders to a renewed dependence on God.

**Worship** – Keasha Wormley and the worship team made up of members of BCM/D churches led in worship.

**Corporate Prayer** – Dan Hyun, Director of Formation & Health, led all in a time of corporate prayer.

### **President's Address**

In his address, Caudle used Psalm 91 to call the church to passionately proclaim God's hope and power to the next generation. He stated that even in the midst of oppression, the Psalmist's heart turned outward, determined to declare God's faithfulness and glory. Caudle emphasized that praise is not passive – it's vocal, communal, and missional, as we shout and speak of God's power in both worship and witness. Ultimately, our desire to reach the next generation must flow from grasping the depth of God's mercy and love that first reached down to rescue us.

### **Business Session**

After a reminder of the rules adopted at the beginning of the meeting, Caudle opened the business session with the nominations for officers.

### **Election of Officers**

Fred Caudle recognized Ron Blankenship, First Vice President, to preside over the presidential election. With no additional nominations presented, the Secretary was instructed to cast a unanimous ballot re-electing Fred Caudle as President for a second term. Likewise, Ron Blankenship was re-elected as Vice President and Anthony Minter as Second Vice President, each unopposed and affirmed unanimously by the body.

## **Annual Meeting Agenda**

Fred Caudle presented the Annual Meeting Agenda for approval. With no questions or additional nominations, the agenda was approved by unanimous vote.

## **Committee Appointments**

Following the agenda approval, committee appointments as listed on pages 30–31 of the Annual Meeting Book were presented for affirmation. No additional nominations or questions were raised from the floor.

RESOLVED, That we are grateful for the churches that give faithfully and sacrificially through the Cooperative Program and for all who who openly promote, support, and commit to the Cooperative Program among our family of churches, associations, and Ministry Partners; and be it finally

RESOLVED, That we commit ourselves to the celebration and promotion of the Cooperative Program within our churches, associations, and entities in its one-hundredth year.

### **Schedule Change**

Somer Phoebus presented a proposed change to the schedule, moving Business Session 2 to take place after breakout sessions and lunch. A motion was made and seconded, and the members voted unanimously to approve the adjustment.

### **Staff Recognition**

Following the lunch break, staff recognitions were presented. Adron Dozat was honored for 10 years of service to the BCM/D, Ellen Udovich for 25 years, and Tom Stolle for 20 years.

### **Announcement**

An announcement was made for the upcoming Church Leader Conference, scheduled for August 7-8, 2025, at Riva Trace Baptist Church in Davidsonville, MD. The conference will provide team training in the areas of NextGen, Demographic Ministry, Ministry to the Marginalized, Pastors, and Administration. The main speaker will be James Myers, Executive Pastor at Biltmore Church in Asheville, NC.

### **Business Session**

GMB President Byron Day invited Executive Director/Chief Financial Officer Tom Stolle to present the 2025 budget to the messengers. Stolle emphasized the continued importance of the Cooperative Program. He noted the impact of selling the Columbia office, resulting in \$2.2 million in net proceeds and establishing a legacy fund that will contribute dollars annually to the budget. While Cooperative Program giving declined by 12.3% from 2018 to 2023, the percentage split remains 63% for in-state use and 37% forwarded to the SBC, totaling \$1,167,349 budgeted distribution in 2024. The budget reflects investment in church health, strengthening, church planting, and missional impact.

Skycroft Conference Center was highlighted as a major revenue source with projected 2025 income of \$2.7 million through increased camps, conferences, and facilities usage. Expenses include significant needs for building repairs and a septic system replacement, for which the \$1.19 million Keith Young Fund may provide support.

### **Foundation Bylaws Updates**

On behalf of the Baptist Foundation, Stolle presented proposed amendments to the Foundation Bylaws.

#### Article I – Trustees

##### Section 1–Meetings

(1) **Three** regular meetings of the Trustees shall be held **each calendar year** ~~in January, May, and October~~ at such times and places as the Trustees may determine. Special meetings may be called by the President or Vice President. At least ten days prior notice of the time and place of any regular or special meeting shall be given to all Trustees.

##### Section 2–Powers

(2) The Trustees shall submit to the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware at each annual meeting a report of its activities during the preceding year, including **a Treasurer’s Report. Financial statements will be examined annually by an outside CPA and** ~~audited Treasurer's Report.~~

#### Article II – Officers

##### Section 1–Election of Officers

The officers of the Baptist Foundation of Maryland/Delaware (BFMD) shall be a President and a Vice President who shall be elected annually by the Trustees. The Executive Director ~~/and the~~ Chief Financial Officer of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware shall serve as Corporate Secretary and Treasurer, respectively. The Trustees from time to time may appoint such additional agents and committees as they may deem advisable and prescribe their duties.

## **Report of Executive Director Tom Stolle**

Welcome to “The Gathering.” I hope you’ll like the look and feel of what we’ve done this year. For a long time, I’ve felt that the annual meeting felt like a business meeting where we also did worship and fellowship. I really want this meeting, what we’re calling “The Gathering,” to be primarily worship, fellowship, resourcing, and equipping, where we do the business we have to do. I truly hope you experience the presence of God and enjoy this gathering.

This year’s theme is, “For nothing will be impossible with God.” (Luke 1:37)

September 15 marked my 20th anniversary with the BCM/D. I have served in many capacities and seen God work in tremendous and amazing ways. However, I am overwhelmed by what He is doing in Maryland/ Delaware at this moment in time. By ourselves, it would be impossible — but God!

### **Tremendous Blessings**

God is still doing amazing things at Skycroft Conference Center. Last year, we sold out seven weeks of summer camp. We added an eighth week of camp this year, and that too quickly sold out! Reboot registration opened early in September; within days, it was 60% full. We are seeing a major impact from our Skycroft camps with salvations, re-dedications, and callings to ministry and missions. Looking ahead, it would be a great opportunity to build a future church planter/pastor pipeline for some of these young people who feel called to ministry.

Our Disability Ministry is flourishing. We had our fourth annual “Everyone Belongs Camp,” which brought more than 40 guests (plus all the buddies and other volunteers!), and we continue to see results. Next year, we are making this a family camp. I am super excited about this!

Another of the incredible highlights of the year was the women’s and men’s conferences. It’s unbelievable! Unreal! At our second annual “Revive” women’s conference, more than 700 women showed up. On the heels of the women’s conference, our men’s conference, “The Whole Gospel for the Whole Man,” brought over 550 men. We’ve seen some incredible worship and equipping time happening through those conferences. We think it’s possible to have 1000 women at our 2025 women’s conference, and we’re looking for a new venue. We’re having incredible momentum in these areas.

Our collegiate is another area where growth is exploding. We have nine established Baptist ministries on Maryland/Delaware campuses and developing ministries in eight! Close to 500 students are involved. Over the past year, they've shared the gospel on campus over 1000 times and almost as much with outside groups. They've seen nearly 59 salvations, with 35 on campus and 24 on spring break. Leaders are discipling 420 students and had 5,700 discipleship meetings over the year. They now have 76 student leaders. This is just really incredible!

### **A Look Ahead**

I am especially excited about our renewed emphasis on church planting and the new strategies we are implementing in this area. Richard and Payton Pope have joined our staff to work in this area. Richard, the pastor of Canvas Church, Salisbury, is working closely with the North American Mission Board to help us lay the groundwork for an indigenous church planting movement. We're seeing some pretty exciting things there. Richard's wife, Payton, will love and minister to the planters' wives.

We want to continue equipping and resourcing church leaders and supporting ministry to those in need, whether financial, mental, spiritual, or crisis mode.

Our alignment with our associational partnership is wonderful. Our convention staff and directors of mission are working shoulder-to-shoulder, side by side, in a very unified way to impact our region for Christ. There's a lot of synergy and cooperation with our partners. We want to continue to grow and deepen these relationships.

We want to continue to forge partnerships with other like-minded believers to advance the gospel in various areas.

Our Disaster Relief/BCM/D Ready ministry continues to be an incredible vehicle for serving our communities. We're seeing more older teens and young adults attending training and sometimes bringing their parents, as well as first-time volunteers showing up for hard work with the goal of loving those in crisis and sharing the gospel. We will continue to lean into DR and expand BCM/D Ready.

We will continue to resource and equip our churches in the area of sexual abuse prevention and protection.

With all the opportunities ahead of us, God has given us a wonderful resource to fund these initiatives.

In September, messengers voted to allow us to move forward and complete the sale of our building on Old Columbia Rd. This allows us to take an underutilized asset that isn't occupied much and turn it into a resource to help us now and leave a legacy for years to come. We will be able to advance church planting and partnership and continue to push into the areas of poverty ministry, disability ministry, disaster relief, and holistic transformation of pastors.

We thank God for all of these blessings. He continues to show that with Him, all things are possible.

## **2023-2024 Summarized Activities of the General Mission Board**

The General Mission Board (GMB) is honored to support the churches within our Convention.

The proposed 2025 budget, presented by the GMB for consideration, includes \$3.175 million in CP receipts along with a commitment to sending 37% of Cooperative Program (CP) dollars to the SBC as our commitment to national and international missions resulting in a budgeted distribution of \$1,167,349. We also share Cooperative Missions dollars with our local associations, invest in Maryland/Delaware church plants, and financially fortify our partnership efforts for existing churches through various ministries. The proposed budget also emphasizes our ongoing dedication to church partnership efforts at home, which include leadership development, ministering to the marginalized, and fostering kingdom growth. Through this budget, we communicate our values: to develop leaders, serve the marginalized, and advance the Kingdom of God. We equip and resource churches to make disciples!

Another noteworthy aspect of this proposed budget is a refreshing shift in the focus of our annual State Missions Offering (SMO). In 2025, every dollar collected will be dedicated to supporting the planting and revitalization of local churches.

The 2025 budget reinforces our commitment to Church Health and Strengthening. We are committed to emphasizing formative ministry to pastors with the following goals:

1. Communicate a BCM/D-wide culture prioritizing transformation as instrumental to our mission
2. Provide formative care ministry for every BCM/D senior pastor with the goal that every pastor has a path- way to grow in a holistically healthy way
3. Consult with interested churches who desire a contextually informed strategy to guide their community in pathways of transformation
4. Champion the unity of the greater BCM/D among our diverse representation of churches and people

Regarding Skycroft Conference Center, the budget emphasizes its role in serving thousands of guests and ministering to over 3,000 students attending on-site camps. Skycroft continues to be an integral part of our church partnership and evangelistic efforts. We have observed an increase in the number of pastors and churches utilizing Skycroft for retreats, and many campers have made significant spiritual decisions through its ministry. This past year, 44 campers made professions of faith in Jesus. The GMB remains

committed to evaluating Skycroft's impact and considering how to best utilize its resources and property for future ministry.

The Skycroft septic system repair/replacement project is ongoing. We expect to receive a response from the State of Maryland soon concerning our system design proposal.

The BCM/D continues its commitment in emphasizing the importance of protecting children and vulnerable adults. Training events for affiliated churches continue to be offered, and we are grateful to our churches as they dedicate themselves to the protection of the vulnerable.

With more than four hundred churches partnering with the BCM/D to share the message of Jesus, we believe that together, we can accomplish far more than we can alone. Many thanks for joining us on a mission that reaps eternal rewards!

## INDEPENDENT ACCOUNTANT'S REVIEW REPORT

To the General Mission Board of the  
Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, Inc.

We have reviewed the accompanying financial statements of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, Inc. (a Nonprofit Organization), which comprise the statement of assets, liabilities and net assets – cash receipts and disbursement basis as of December 31, 2024, and the related statements of budgeted activities – cash receipts and disbursement basis and changes in net assets – cash receipts and disbursement basis for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements. A review includes primarily applying analytical procedures to management's financial data and making inquiries of management. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit, the objective of which is the expression of an opinion regarding the financial statements as a whole. Accordingly, we do not express such an opinion.

### Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with the cash receipts and disbursement basis of accounting; this includes determining that the cash receipts and disbursement basis of accounting is an acceptable basis for the preparation of financial statements in the circumstances. Management is also responsible for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement whether due to fraud or error.

### Accountant's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to conduct the review engagement in accordance with Statements on Standards for Accounting and Review Services promulgated by the Accounting and Review Services Committee of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. Those standards require us to perform procedures to obtain limited assurance as a basis for reporting whether we are aware of any material modifications that should be made to the financial statements for them to be in accordance with the cash receipts and disbursement basis of accounting. We believe that the results of our procedures provide a reasonable basis for our conclusion.

We are required to be independent of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, Inc. and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements related to our review.

### Accountant's Conclusion

Based on our review, we are not aware of any material modifications that should be made to the accompanying financial statements in order for them to be in accordance with the cash receipts and disbursements basis of accounting.

### Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to the notes to the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the cash receipts and disbursement basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Our conclusion is not modified with respect to this matter.

**Note 1 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

*Date of Management Review:* Management has evaluated subsequent events through March 13, 2025, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued. The Organization did not have any material recognizable subsequent events during this period.

*Organizational Purpose:* As stated by the mission statement of the Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware, Inc. (the "Organization"), it will intentionally assist the starting and strengthening of congregations so that together they can fulfill Jesus' commands in Matthew 28:19-20 and Acts 1:8. The Organization derives the majority of their income from individuals and churches in Maryland and Delaware.

*Basis of Accounting:* These statements are presented on the cash receipts and disbursements basis. The cash receipts and disbursements basis require that revenues and the related assets be recognized when received rather than when earned, and certain expenses be recognized when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred. However, these financial statements have been modified to reflect certain items budgeted for 2024 even though the actual funds related to those items have not been received or expended as of December 31, 2024. The statement of budgeted activities – cash receipts and disbursement basis reports only those transactions that were budgeted for in 2024.

Funds received by the Organization to be used for purposes unrelated to the operating activities of the Organization are recorded as a cash exchange liability until such funds have been disbursed.

*Financial Statement Presentation:* The Organization has adopted the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Updated (ASU) 2016-14, "Not-for-Profit Entities (Topic 958): Presentation of Financial Statements of Not-for-Profit Entities." Under ASU 2016-14, the Organization is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to the following two classes of net assets:

Without Donor Restrictions

Net assets which are free of donor-imposed restrictions. Included net assets are donor advised funds, for which donors may make recommendations to the Board of Trustees with respect to the distribution of the income and/or principal for an agreed upon period of time. The Board of Trustees has complete discretion on whether to accept or reject the donor's recommendation.

With Donor Restrictions

The Organization reports gifts of cash and other assets as restricted support if they are received with donor or grantor stipulations that limit the use of the donated assets. Some donor-imposed restrictions are temporary in nature, such as those that will be met by the passage of time or other specified events. When time or purpose restrictions expire, or are achieved, the net assets are reclassified to net assets without donor restrictions. Other restrictions are perpetual in nature, where resources are to be maintained in perpetuity.

The Organization has adopted the FASB issued ASU 2018-13, "Fair Value Measurement (Topic 820): Disclosure Framework – Changes to the Disclosure Requirements for Fair Value Measurement." The standards core principle is to improve the effectiveness of disclosures in the notes to the financial statements.

*Cash and Cash Equivalents:* Cash and cash equivalents include all monies in banks and highly liquid debt instruments that mature in 90 days or less available for use to meet the needs for general expenditures within one year of the balance sheet date.

*Other Current Assets:* Other current assets consist of inventories and prepaid expenses. Inventories are stated at the lower of cost or market using the first-in, first-out (FIFO) method. Inventory consists of various supplies on hand needed for the operations of the Organization.

**Note 1 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)**

*Property Owned:* Property and equipment that have been capitalized are stated at cost. Assets purchased in excess of \$2,500 which have a useful life in excess of one year, are capitalized. Major additions and betterments are charged to the asset accounts only to the extent the costs have been reflected in the operating budget. Management periodically reviews the utilization of assets and removes those assets that no longer have a useful life. Depreciation is not recorded since the operating budget makes no provision for non-cash expenses; accordingly, an impairment loss from the valuation of long-lived assets under FASB Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820 would not be recorded.

*Cooperative Giving:* The Organization adopted FASB ASC 958-605, "Not-for-Profit Entities – Revenue Recognition." In accordance with FASB ASC 958-605, contributions received are recorded without donor restrictions or with donor restrictions support depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor restrictions. Promises to give are not recorded as cooperative giving until the funds are received.

*Investments and Investment Income:* The Organization elected to adopt FASB ASC 958-320, "Not-for-Profit Entities – Investments – Debt & Equity Securities." Under FASB ASC 958-320, investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities are valued at their fair values in the statement of financial position.

Investments, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. It is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments could occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statement of financial position.

Investments held at the Baptist Foundation of Maryland/Delaware, Inc. are available to meet the needs for general expenditures of the Organization.

*Liquidity:* All cash and receivables of the organization are available to meet general expenditures within one year of the balance sheet date.

*Income Taxes:* The Organization is exempt from Federal taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Organization is required to file a return to report unrelated business income generated at the Skycroft Convention Center. At December 31, 2024 the provision for unrelated business income tax was \$0. The Organization's Federal tax returns generally stay open to examination for three years from the filing date.

*Estimates:* The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the modified cash receipts and disbursements method used by the Organization, requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the reported period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Note 2 – Cash and Cash Equivalents**

The Organization maintains its cash accounts at various financial institutions and its balances may at times exceed the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) insured limits. The Organization has not experienced any losses in such accounts and monitors the creditworthiness of the financial institutions with which it conducts business. Management believes that the Organization is not exposed to any significant credit risk with respect to its cash balances.

**Note 3 – Baptist Foundation of Maryland/Delaware, Inc.**

This account represents funds transferred to the Baptist Foundation of Maryland/Delaware, Inc., which is the agency designated for the management of trust funds. Income earned from these funds is returned to the Organization or its designated agencies.

Marketable securities invested with the Baptist Foundation of Maryland/Delaware, Inc. are stated at fair value and are summarized as follows:

**Note 4 – Investments and Fair Value Measurements**

The Organization accounts for the fair value of its investments under the Fair Value Measurement and Disclosure topic of the FASB ASC 820-10, which provides the framework for measuring fair value. The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurement) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurement). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under this guidance are described as follows:

**Level 1**

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Organization has the ability to access.

**Level 2**

Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets, quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets, inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability, and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

**Level 3**

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and maximize the use of unobservable inputs.

There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from, and relates directly to, the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements.

Note 4 – Investments and Fair Value Measurements *(continued)*

The Organization's financial instruments, none of which are held for trading purposes, include cash and marketable securities. The Organization estimates that fair value of all financial instruments at December 31, 2024 does not differ materially from the aggregate carrying values of its financial instruments recorded in these statements. The estimated fair value amounts have been determined by the Organization using available market and appropriate valuation methodologies. Considerable judgment is necessarily required in interpreting market data to develop the estimates of fair value, and accordingly, the estimates are not necessarily indicative of the amounts that the Organization could realize in a current market exchange.

**Note 6 – Retirement Plan**

The Organization provides a tax qualified retirement plan for the benefit of eligible employees. Employees become eligible within six months of their starting date, with contributions equaling 10% of current year compensation. The plan is designated to provide employees with an accumulation of funds for retirement on a tax-deferred basis and provides for annual discretionary contributions. The expense was \$132,943 for the year ending December 31, 2024.

**Note 7 – Related Party Transactions**

The Organization provides the services of their employees to the Baptist Foundation of Maryland/Delaware, Inc. Investment income and administrative fees paid by the Baptist Foundation of Maryland/Delaware, Inc. support the administrative costs incurred by the Organization. Distributions received from the Baptist Foundation of Maryland/Delaware, Inc. were \$284,000 for the year ended December 31, 2024, which are included in receipts on the statement of budgeted activities – cash receipts and disbursement basis. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Organization received \$83,509 of income distributions, returned \$38,238 of excess distributions, and received \$36,306 of management fees from Baptist Foundation of Maryland/Delaware, Inc., which are all included in cash exchange on the statement of assets, liabilities and net assets – cash receipts and disbursement basis as of December 31, 2024.

**Note 8 – Skycroft Conference Center and Note Payable**

Owned and operated by the Organization, Skycroft is located on over 341 acres in Frederick County, Maryland. The center opened in 1977 to offer the opportunity to slip away into a quiet spot to reflect, to be re-created, to be refreshed in the beauty of “God’s great outdoors.”

On December 30, 2016, the Organization purchased approximately 41 additional acres of land to add to Skycroft for a purchase price of \$325,000. The Organization obtained a note payable in the principal amount of \$276,250, secured by the land, to partially fund the purchase. The note payable requires monthly payments of principal and interest in the amount of \$2,036. The note payable bears interest at a rate of 3.89% per year and matures in December 2031. Interest incurred and paid on the note payable was \$6,278 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

## **Skycroft Conference Center Report**

We are thankful for all the Lord is doing at Sky- croft this year! The Skycroft team has been busy with many campus improvements. Thus far in 2024, we have given our registration building a facelift, put a new roof on Poplar Lodge, expanded campus security with surveillance, re- placed two exterior decks, and upgraded flooring in four buildings.

Of course, in addition to our incredibly blessed camps, God is at work in the lives of guests at Skycroft every month of the calendar year as people gather on the mountaintop for women's, men's and youth retreats, Sunday school teacher training, missions conferences, church staff and elder retreats, school events and much more.

We are on track to see over 17,000 guests in 2024. God continues to use Skycroft as a setting where thousands gather to hear His voice.

## **Baptist Foundation of Maryland/Delaware, Inc.**

The Baptist Foundation of Maryland/Delaware is dedicated to furthering the message of the gospel by carefully managing invested funds that support Baptist initiatives both locally and globally. We also offer loans to churches and associations affiliated with the BCM/D.

Currently, the Foundation manages assets totaling approximately \$15.7 million, which includes \$12.6 million in invested funds and \$3.1 million in church loan funds. This represents significant growth from the \$3.8 million managed in 1991. For the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024, the Foundation provided \$737,075.80 to support ministries and missions associated with the SBC and BCM/D.

Through our Church Loan programs, we are assisting 16 BCM/D affiliated churches with around \$2.7 million in outstanding loans. These loans offer benefits such as favorable interest rates and low closing costs. In addition to the above referenced distribution, the Foundation contributes annually to the BCM/D to equip and resource churches to make disciples. For the fiscal year ended September 30, 2024, this distribution amounted to \$135,656.94.

The Baptist Foundation is well-positioned to manage endowment funds for churches while offering cost savings on administration.
