Discipleship Formation Diploma

The George Liele Leadership Institute offers an Associates Diploma and a Diploma. The Associates Diploma will be awarded upon the completion of 7 satisfactorily finished courses (minimal of 5 required courses) and the Diploma will be awarded upon the completion of 15 satisfactorily finished courses (12 required courses and 3 elective courses). Each course satisfactorily completed earns 2 credit hours. Each class requires a 10-week commitment. All classes are on-line (virtual) with a live instructor.

Old Testament Survey III (Monday)

Instructor: Keifer Bent

This course is a survey of 17 books of the Old Testament (Isaiah-Malachi). The student will learn the central theme, general contents, purpose, and historical settings of each book as it is examined and applied to contemporary life.

Basic Bible Doctrines II (Monday)

Instructor: Victor Kirk

This 10-week course introduces students to the next five foundational doctrines of the Christian faith—Salvation (Soteriology), Future Things (Eschatology), Church (Ecclesiology), Sin (Hamartiology), and Humanity (Anthropology). Students will examine key Scriptures, learn essential truths about God's nature and His revelation to humanity, and understand how these doctrines shape Christian life and belief. Through study, discussion, and memorization, students will deepen their biblical knowledge and spiritual maturity.

Prayer and Spiritual Warfare (Tuesday)

Instructor: Dennis Marshall

This course provides believers with a biblical foundation on prayer and spiritual warfare, teaching them to pray confidently and with discernment based on Scripture. It equips students with practical tools to stand firm during spiritual conflicts and to serve effectively in both church and community settings.

Revelation I (Tuesday)

Instructor: Vernon Lattimore

This course offers a guided exploration of Revelation chapters 1–11, centring on Jesus Christ as the risen and reigning Lord and His message to the Church. Students will engage the book's powerful imagery, spiritual conflict, and unfolding vision of God's redemptive plan and righteous judgment. Designed for both new and seasoned Bible students, the course equips learners to interpret Revelation faithfully and apply its message of hope, perseverance, and ultimate victory to life and ministry today.

Our Institute

The George Liele Leadership Institute (G.L.L.I.) was established to continue the legacy of George Liele, one of America's first missionaries and the first African American missionary for the SBC. He is a significant figure in the history of Christian missions. Even though William Carey may be called the father of the modern missionary movement, George Liele left America and planted the Gospel in Jamaica a full 10 years before Carey left England in 1793.

George Liele became a Christian in 1773, at the age of 23, and was baptized by his white pastor, Matthew Moore. Sometime after Liele's conversion, his owner, Henry Sharp, who was a Baptist deacon, gave Liele his freedom so he could pursue God's call to preach the Gospel. Liele preached for two years in the slave quarters on plantations surrounding Savannah and into South Carolina. Because of his faithfulness and powerful preaching of the Word of God, many surrendered their lives to Jesus Christ. George Liele was ordained on May 20, 1775, becoming the first ordained African American Baptist preacher in America. After his ordination, he planted the first African American Baptist Church in North America, a church still in existence today. In 1778, Henry Sharp, Liele's former owner, was killed in the Revolutionary War. After his death, Sharp's heirs took steps to re-enslave Liele. As a result of their actions, Liele was thrown in jail. Eventually, he was able to produce proper documentation concerning his freedom and was released.

Soon after Liele's release, Moses Kirkland, a colonel of the British Army, befriended him and helped him leave the country. Kirkland helped pay for Liele's trip to Jamaica, and after two years, Liele paid this debt and obtained a certificate of freedom for himself and his family. In 1782, George, his wife, Hannah, and their four children left Savannah and relocated to Kingston, Jamaica. At that time, Jamaica was a British colony.



Once established, Liele planted a church and held a baptism service every three months. In 1814, there were approximately 8,000 Baptists in Jamaica. This number included enslaved people, freedmen, and some whites. As a result of Liele's ministry, there were over 20,000 believers by 1832. Not only did Liele's ministry lead to a spiritual impact on the island, but his work also made a social difference for the enslaved persons in Jamaica. By July 31, 1838, slavery was eradicated in Jamaica.

Liele was an effective missionary, evangelist, and church planter. He was known for encouraging his converts to go preach the Gospel to the lost, which led to converts delivering the message of salvation in Savannah, Nova Scotia, and Sierra Leone.

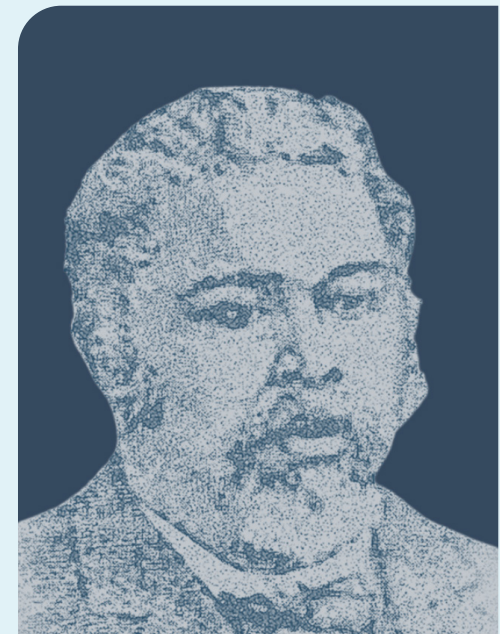
Our Mission
